

If the Commissioners therein named, at my Office in Frederick City Md., proceeded to take the following Additional testimony on the 17th day of May, 1870 at 10 1/2 O'clock A.M. ~ Joseph Murphy, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainants being duly sworn and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commission and herewith returned deposes and says ~

To the 1st Int. ~ I know all the parties to this suit, and have known them for some years. ~ To the 2nd Int. ~ Their names are, Mary Ann Creager, Joseph Murphy and Cecelia his wife, Jacob A. Dronberger and Mary Catharine his wife, John David Creager, Melinda K. Creager his wife and William Henry Creager. ~ The females are all married except Mary Ann Creager who is the Widow of John William Creager deceased. ~ The Males are all adults except William Henry who is about fifteen years of age. ~ They all live in Frederick County, Maryland.

To the 3rd Int. ~ Not a cent has been paid to Mary Ann Creager, Cecelia Murphy, or Mary Catharine Dronberger, or either of them of their shares of the estate of John W. Creager deceased, growing out of their interests in the appraised value of the real estate of said deceased. The Real Estate of ~~John W. Creager~~ has been in possession of John David Creager ever since the death of said John William. ~ In the year 1868, John David paid to Mary Ann Creager, Cecelia Murphy and Mary Catharine Dronberger each Ninety dollars which he claimed to be for rent for said property. ~ In the year 1869, the said John David paid to the said Mary Ann Creager, Cecelia Murphy, and Mary Catharine Dronberger each seven dollars and twenty five cents, which the said John David claimed to be their proportion of the rental value after deducting for repairs that he claimed to have made to the property. ~

To the 4th Int. No money has ever been paid by John David Creager in satisfaction and discharge of the Claims of said Mary Ann, Cecelia and Mary Catharine, upon said Real Estate, under the last Will and Testament of John William Creager deceased, except the Amount mentioned in the Answer of the last Interrogatory, nor has any money whatever been paid by William Henry, or any person in his behalf. ~

There being no further witnesses to be examined, and neither party desiring further time for the production of his testimony, the Commissioners closed the said Commission and herewith returned the same under his hand and seal this 17th day of April in the year 1870 ~
