Be it remembered that heretofore, to wit: On the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord, One thousand Eight hundred and Seventy, came into Court here the said Samuel Burall, by Milton & Wm. C. his Solicitor, and filed here the following Petition and Report, together with Exhibits named therein.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity.

The Petition and Report of Samuel Burall of Frederick County, respectfully shows unto your Honors, that on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of March 1868, a certain Jacob Juricks of Frederick County, executed his deed of Mortgage of said date, whereby he conveyed to your Petitioner certain real estate described in said Mortgage, herewith filed as Exhibit No 1. to this petition, to secure to your Petitioner the sum of Four hundred dollars, with interest thereon from said date, then due and owing to your Petitioner from said Jacob Juricks Jr. as a balance of the purchase money for said real estate bought by said Juricks from your Petitioner; that in said deed of Mortgage was a provision that if the said Jacob Juricks Jr. should fail to pay to your Petitioner the said sum of four hundred dollars with the interest thereon from the date of said Mortgage, or the first day of April 1869, then your Petitioner was authorized to sell said real estate at public sale for cash, after giving at least twenty days public notice of time place manner and terms of sale, in some newspaper published in Frederick County prior to the day of sale, and to apply the proceeds of such sale to the
