2^d Sub. ~ Did you or did you not know Samuel Young? ~ If yes, is he living or dead, if dead, when did he die? State your knowledge herein. ~

3^d Sub. ~ Did Samuel Young have any real Estate? If yes, look at Exhibits C. & D. Do or do not said Exhibits describe the Real Estate, of which said Samuel Young died seized and possessed,? If yes, state all your knowledge herein. ~

4th Sub. ~ Do you, or do you not know the widow and children of said Samuel Young deceased? ~ If yes, state their names, residence, and which are adults, and which are infants under the age of twenty one years, state fully all your knowledge herein. ~

5th Sub. ~ Do you, or do you not know whether said Samuel Young in his life time was indebted or not to the Complainant Abraham Trimmer? If yes, state how much and on what account, and if any part has been paid, how much? Look at Exhibit "A" now shown you - Does or does not said Exhibit state such debt and the payments thereon? State fully all your knowledge herein. ~
