1<sup>st</sup> Sub: Do you or not know the parties Complainant and Defendant in the title of these interrogatories named, or any or which of them? If yes, state how long you have known them, ~

Answer. ~ I know all the parties, and have known them for many years. ~

2<sup>nd</sup> Sub: ~ Did you or did you not know Samuel Young? If yes, in the living or dead? If dead when did he die ~ State your knowledge herein. ~

Answer, I did know Samuel Young, &c. died in February. ~

3<sup>rd</sup> Sub. ~ Did Samuel Young leave any Real Estate? If yes, look at Exhibits to Vol. ~ Do or do not said Exhibits describe the Real Estate of which said Samuel Young died seized and possessed, if yes, state all your knowledge herein. ~

Answer ~ I look at Exhibits A & B said Exhibits do describe the Real Estate of which Samuel Young died seized and possessed. ~

4<sup>th</sup> Sub. Do you or not know the widow and children of said Samuel Young deceased? If yes, state their names, residence and which are adults and which infants under the age of twenty one years. ~ State fully all your knowledge herein. ~

Answer. ~ I do know the widow and children of Samuel Young deceased His widow's name is Susan Young, The names of his children are Mary, Le Young, John St. Young, Samuel David Young, Sarah L. Young, Susan E. Young, Margaret A. Young, Ida F. Young, Sophie C. Young, and William F. Young, All of his children are infants under the age of twenty one years. Both his widow and his children live in Frederick County, Maryland. ~

5<sup>th</sup> Sub ~ Do you, or do you not know whether said Samuel Young, in his lifetime was indebted or not to the complainant Abraham Primmer, if yes, state how much, and on what account, and if any part has been paid, how much? Look at Exhibit A. now shown you, Does or does not said Exhibit state such debt and the payments thereon. ~ State fully all your knowledge herein. ~

Answer. ~ I look at Exhibit "A." and believe the account therein is correct.

6<sup>th</sup> Sub. ~ Do you or not know who administered upon the personal estate of said Samuel Young? If yes, state the name of the person. Have you any means of knowing the condition of the personal Estate of said Samuel Young deceased, and of the debts due by said Samuel Young? If yes, state how you have obtained that knowledge, and whether the personal estate of said Samuel Young is sufficient to pay his debts. ~ State all your knowledge herein. ~
