This Cause standing ready for a hearing upon the return of the Commission-
ers to lay off the Dower of Catherine Worthington widow of Upton Worthington,
and being submitted, and no cause to the contrary being shown, the proceedings
were read and considered. ~

It is therefore this Seventeenth day of May in the year 1870 by the Judges
of the Sixth Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland, and by the authority
of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity,
adjudged, ordered, and decreed, that the return of the Commissioners filed
in this Cause, be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed, and that
the said Catherine Worthington shall have and hold in severalty for and
during the term of her natural life, and as and for her dower in the
real Estate in the proceedings mentioned, all that part of the said real estate,
which is described in the aforesaid return of the Commissioners being part
of the Tract of Land called the "Resurvey on Hope", as beginning at the end
of 75 3/4 perches on the 2nd line of the whole estate and running with the
outlines thereof, with an allowance of 2 degrees for variation the ten following
Courses to wit South 72 degrees East 130 1/4 perches, South 3 degrees East 19 1/2
perches, South 31 1/2 degrees West 28 perches, South 25 degrees West 33 perches,
South 29 3/4 degrees West 30 perches, South 34 degrees West 44 perches, South
40 1/2 degrees West 29 perches, North 82 degrees West 29 perches, North
28 degrees East 32 perches, North 58 1/2 degrees West 105 perches, North 35
degrees East 132 1/2 perches to the place of beginning, containing 114 Acres
and 34 Square perches of Land more or less. Also a Wood Lot beginning
at the end of the 8th line of the whole estate, and running South 53 1/2 degrees
West 112 1/4 perches, North 2 1/2 degrees West 19 1/2 perches, North 53 1/2 degrees
East 105 perches, South 53 degrees 18 1/2 perches to the place of beginning,
containing 13 1/2 Acres of ground more or less. ~

of these proceedings to be taxed by the Clerks, be paid out of the pro-
ceeds of sale of the Real Estate, when made under a decree to be passed
by this Court. ~
