

discretion of my Executor hereinafter named, and after my debts and funeral charges are paid, and my liabilities all discharged, I devise that my Executors shall sell all my property both personal and real that may not be disposed of otherwise, by this my last Will and Testament, and inasmuch as my Sisters hereinafter named have been partly instrumented in making and saving what I possess, and also my Brother Benjamin H. Duwall to some extent, I give and bequeath to each of my single Sisters viz. Juliana H. Duwall, Sarah H. Duwall and Cordelia Duwall the sum of One thousand Dollars. to my married sister Ruth Delashmutt the sum of Six hundred Dollars, and to my Brother Benjamin H. Duwall I give and bequeath my Servant Man Thomas, to serve for a term of years as per Bill of Sale from the Executors of William Lynch deceased, and I also give to him any and all property he may have in his possession belonging to me at the time of my decease, and I hereby release him from any and all indebtedness to me by note or Book account. I give and bequeath to my said single Sisters Juliana, Sarah and Cordelia, all the personal property consisting of Furniture &c in the House and buildings which they occupy as joint Tenants, also my servant Woman, or girl, Mary which I purchased of the Estate of David Knapp late of Frederick County, as a slave for life, but I hereby will and decree that the said Girl Mary shall be set free and at liberty when she arrives at the age of thirty five years, and her issue if any, to be free when the females are eighteen and the males are twenty one years of age, and her issue's issue forever to be free. I also bequeath to my said sister my old excellent servant woman Becky, and request that she shall be well cared for during her life.

Contemplating marriage very soon, I give and bequeath all the residue of my property both personal and real, to my beloved wife, should I be married, if I leave none. I bequeath the residue of my property to my sister Juliana, or, rather that the said residue be put on interest, and she to have the interest on the same during her life, then to be disposed of as follows. 1st I give and bequeath to the Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars. 2nd I give and bequeath to the Association for the protection of Aged Women, known as the Aged Women's Home, in the City of Baltimore, Five Hundred Dollars. 3rd I give and bequeath to my sister Rebecca Baker the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, and the residue I give and bequeath to my Brother Benjamin H. Duwall, provided that he shall furnish to my single sisters, should such be living, a home and comfortable accommodations, including of course boarding so long as they may desire it, should he fail to do that, then said residue of my estate shall be paid to my single sisters. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother Benjamin H. Duwall and my Brother-in-law Arthur Delashmutt my Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
