

To the 6th Sub: That he is acquainted with the lands of which Grafton Duwall died seized and possessed. That he looks at Exhibits Nos 7 9. 10. 11. 12 13. 14 and 15 and they do describe certain portions thereof. But the property described in Exhibit No 8, is not the property of Grafton Duwall, but belongs to the Methodist Episcopal Church. ~

The 7th Sub waived as to this witness ~

To the 8th Sub: That the land described in Exhibit No 13, was sold to Jacob Kerish, That he does not think Mr Kerish has paid the whole purchase money, Witness does not know how much of the purchase money Kerish has paid. ~

Ed Amos Cunningham, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioners and herewith returned, deposes and says ~

To the 1st Sub: That he knows the parties to this suit and has known them for many years ~

To the 2nd Sub: That he has seen Grafton Duwall write, and knows his hand-writing well. He looks at the signature Grafton Duwall attached to Exhibits Nos. 1. 2. 3. 4 and says that it is in the handwriting of the said Grafton Duwall deceased. ~

To the 3rd Sub: That he was acquainted with Grafton Duwall formerly a resident of Frederick County. He died on the 29th day of October, 1868 in Frederick County, State of Maryland. ~

To the 4th Sub: That Grafton Duwall was married at the time of his death, Columbia J Duwall is his widow, and she resides in Frederick County, State of Maryland.

To the 5th Sub: That he left two children, Samuel G. and Edam S. Duwall, both under twenty one years of age, and live in Frederick County Maryland. ~

To the 6th Sub: That he is acquainted with the land of which Grafton Duwall died seized and possessed, Witness looks at Exhibits Nos 7 9. 10. 11. 12, 13 14. 15, and they do describe certain portions thereof. The property described in Exhibit No 8 is not the property of Grafton Duwall, but belongs to the Methodist Episcopal Church. ~

To the 7th Sub: That Mr Duwall bought from witness a parcel of land in Frederick County, and has paid for it, for which land Mr Duwall has no deed, but the said property is described in a deed from Lewis Kemp to Grafton Duwall and others recorded in Liber C. S. No 7 folios 701 and 702 one of the Land Records of Frederick County and marked Exhibit No 9, in this cause. ~

To the 8th Sub: That Mr Duwall told witness that he had sold the property described in Exhibit No 13 to Jacob Kerish, for which Mr Kerish had not paid him. ~

Col. William Richardson, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories
