To the 1st Sub. ~ That he is acquainted with the parties to this suit, and has known them for a long space of time.



To the 2nd Sub. ~ That he was acquainted with a certain John J. Willson, formerly a resident of Frederick County. ~ He died in the Month of August in the year 1870 ~

To the 4th Sub. ~ The said John J. Willson did leave children at the time of his death, to wit, Anna J., Adelya R., Harrieh M., Mary C., John J. Willson, Adults over the age of twenty one years, Eleanor P. Willson, Tyler B. Willson, Annie P. Willson, Bradley J. Willson infants under the age of twenty one years. ~ They all reside in Frederick County, State of Maryland. ~

To the 3rd Sub. ~ The said John J. Willson was married at the time of his death, and left a widow with the name Anna L. P. Willson, who resides now in Frederick County, State of Maryland. ~

To the 5th Sub. ~ I am acquainted with the Real Estate whereof John J. Willson died seized and possessed. I look at the papers now shown me marked Exhibits Nos. 1 & 2. They do describe the Real Estate of which said Willson died seized and possessed, said lands cannot be divided without loss or injury, among the parties interested ~ It would be to the advantage of all parties concerned to have the property sold, and proceeds divided among the parties entitled.

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, and neither party desiring further time for the production of his witnesses, the Commissioners closed the said Commission and herewith return the same under their hand and seal this 19th day of September in the year 1870. ~



