Lynch, one of the Associate Judges of the Fifth Judicial Circuit Court of the State of Maryland, and by the authority of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, adjudged, ordered and decreed that the Complainant is entitled to the relief in the premises, But because it doth not certainly appear to what relief the Complainant is entitled, it is further adjudged and ordered that a Commission issue to Francis Brungle and J. E. R. Wood standing Commissioners of this Court, to take testimony to support the allegations of the Bill.
