To the Honorable the Judges of the Sixth Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland sitting in the Circuit Court for Frederick County in Equity. ~

The Petition of William St. Wagner and George St Kisselman of Frederick County State of Maryland, Sheweth: That heretofore on the fifth day of April in the year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy - Jesse Kisselman and Elizabeth Kisselman his wife, by deed conveyed all their right, title, interest, and estate in and to the property real and personal therein mentioned, to the said William St. Wagner and George St Kisselman in trust to sell the said estate and collect all debts, and apply the proceeds of such estate as follows. ~

- 1st To the payment of all expenses, connected with the Execution of this trust, Counsel fees, Commissions to the Trustees, such as are allowed Trustees by decrees in Chancery for the sales of Land. ~
- 2^d All Taxes if any, and all Mortgages, Judgments, liens and incumbrances according to their respective priorities. ~
- 3^d To the payment of all such Creditors of the said Jesse Kisselman
