Flook - Also a tract of land called "Ebenezer" containing twenty six acres and fourteen perches of land - and part of a tract of land called "The Resurvey on Locust Valley" containing nine and one half acres and twenty square perches of land, conveyed by John H. Your Complainants further state that the said Daniel B. Flook, in his lifetime purchased of Philip Flook - a small tract or parcel of land containing Eleven acres of land more or less, but died before receiving a deed of the same, and that at the time of his death was in possession of the same - and was at the time of his death seized and possessed of all the lands described as aforesaid. ~

Your Complainants further charge that the said Daniel B. Flook died in the Month of May as charged aforesaid, leaving a widow Elizabeth Susan Flook him surviving, who is entitled to dower in all of said lands - and the following Children his heirs at law, viz

- 1 William Swoely Flook, a son -
- 2 Louis M. Flook a son -
- 3 John P. Flook a son -
4. Millard P. Flook a son - and
- 5 Fanny Elizabeth Flook a daughter to whom said lands descended as tenants in Common. ~

Your Complainants further charge that the said John P. Flook, Millard P. Flook and Fanny E. Flook are infants under the age of twenty one years and reside in Frederick County. ~

Your Complainants further charge that the said real estate mentioned in these proceedings, cannot be divided amongst the parties interested without loss and injury, and that it would be to the interest and advantage of all interested, that the real estate herein mentioned be sold and the proceeds of the sale thereof be divided amongst all the parties interested according to their respective rights. ~

It is the end therefore that the defendants, hereinafter named may answer the several matters and things therein charged, the same as if they were herein again repeated and they were hereunto specially interrogated. - And that the real estate herein mentioned may be sold under and by virtue of a decree of your Honorable Court, to be passed in said Cause, and that your Complainants may have such further and other relief in the premises as the nature and Equity of their Cause may require ~

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Complainants the writ of Subpoena against the said Elizabeth Flook, John P. Flook, Millard
