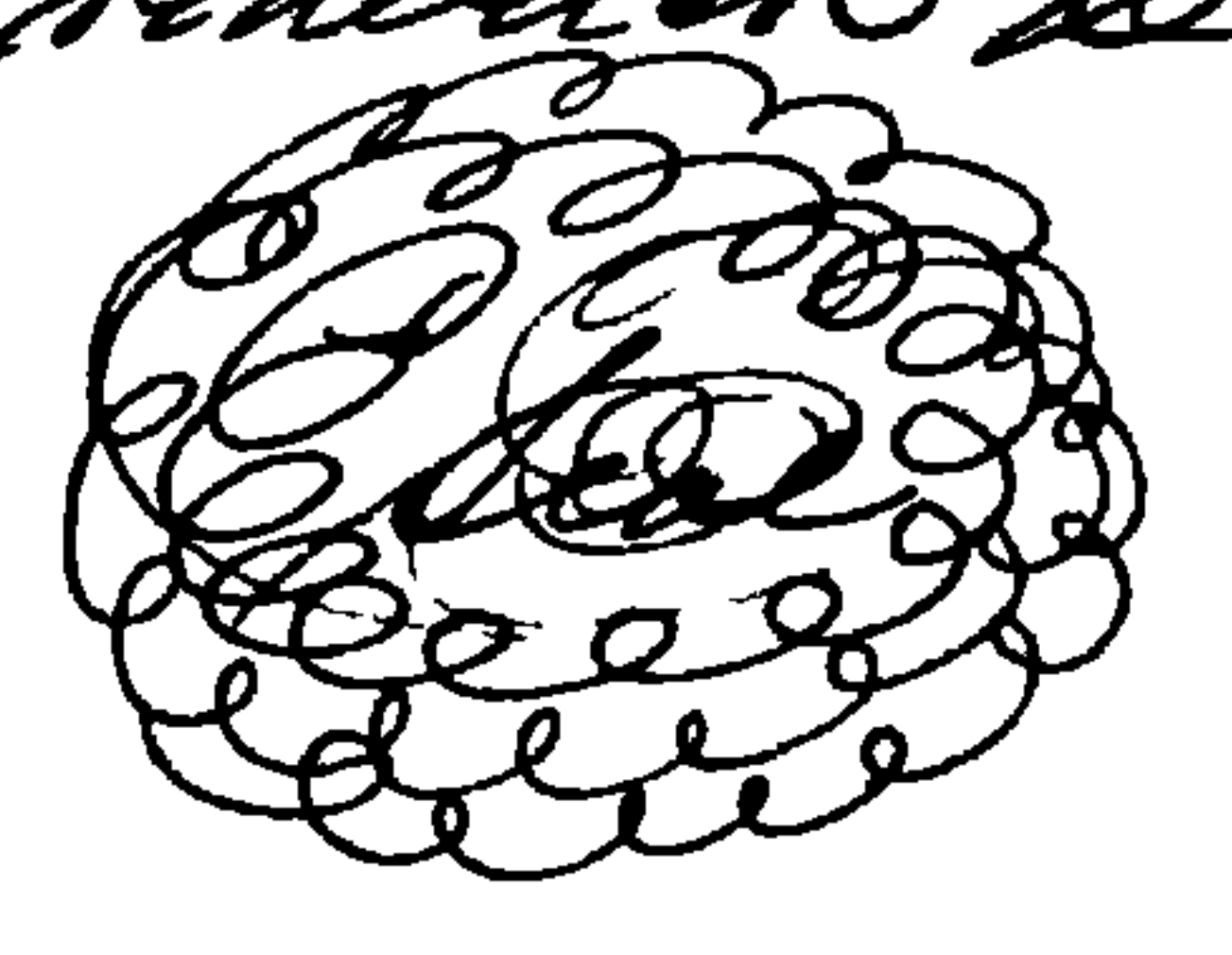

This Deed, made this first day of April in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty three, by Michael Zimmerman, Sheriff of Frederick County Maryland Witnesseth, that by virtue of two writs of Fieri Facias, issued out of the Circuit Court in and for Frederick County, and dated the 12th day of December Eighteen hundred and sixty two, in the case of Randolph Shafer and Robert Shafer, and Peter Shafer, vs Jacob L. Flook, the said Michael Zimmerman as Sheriff of said County, has sold to Daniel P. Flook, for the sum of Two thousand Nine hundred and twenty one Dollars, and forty five Cents, the following real property, to wit: all that part of a tract of land, called, "The Rectory or Whiskey Alley" - part of a tract of land called "The Foresh," and part of a tract of land called "Joined Together" it being part of the same lands
