At the execution of the annexed Commission, issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity, and to me directed, directing and empowering me to examine witnesses in the Cause depending in the said Court in which William S. Flook and Lewis M. S. Flook are Complainants, and Elizabeth S. Flook, John P. Flook and others are defendants, I Francis Brangle Commissioner therein named, at my Office in Frederick City Md. at two o'clock P. M. on the 26th day of November in the year 1870, did proceed to take the following testimony ~

Philip Flook, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainants, being duly sworn, and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioner, and herewith returned, deposes and says to -

The 1st Sub: ~ That he knows the parties to this suit, and has known them for many years ~

2nd Sub: ~ Daniel B. Flook, died in the summer, I think, of 1840 in Frederick County Maryland. ~

3rd Sub: ~ He died leaving a widow, named Elizabeth, who resides in Frederick County Maryland. ~
