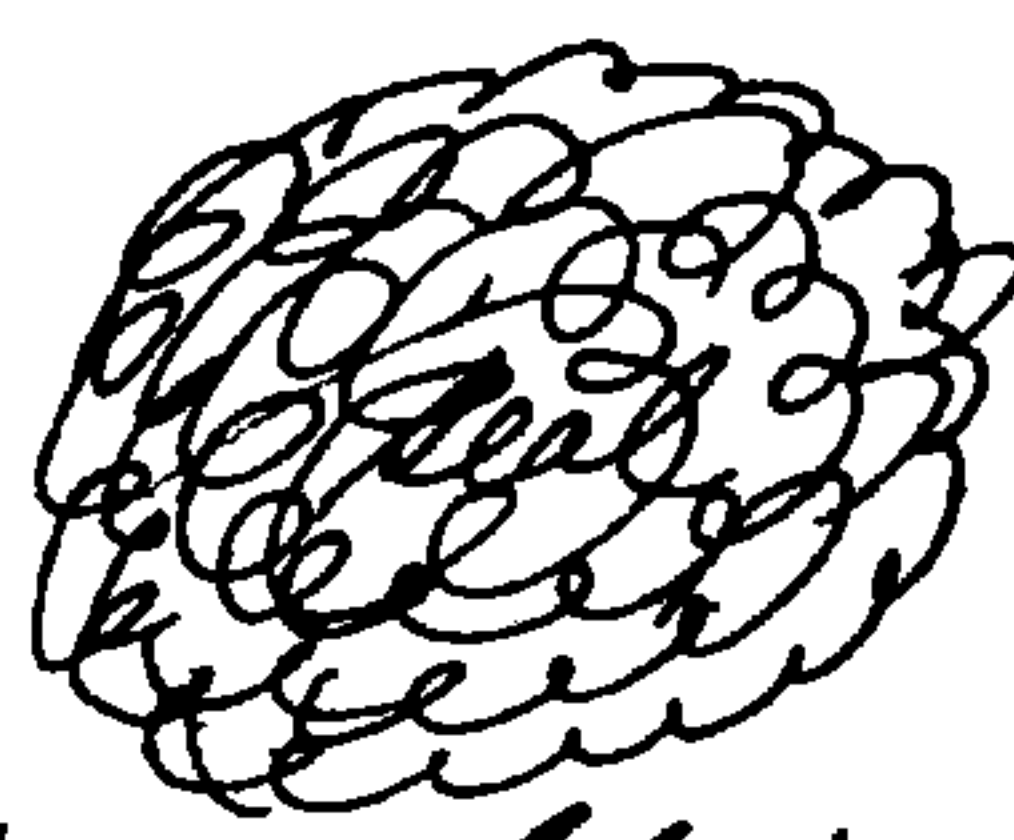

This Mortgage made this fifteenth day of March in the year Eighteen Hundred and Sixty four by Susan Albangle and John W Albangle her husband, Witnesses, that we Susan Albangle and John W Albangle being now indebted to Frederick White of Frederick County in the sum of One Hundred and twenty five Dollars and ninety Cents with interest from date as by our fourth Note dated this date, payable six Months after date, doth fully appear, and the said Frederick White has further become security for us the said Susan Albangle and John W Albangle, in a note dated on the 12th inst. to Joel Myers in the sum of One Hundred and six Dollars with interest payable nine months after date, and in another note dated 10th of March inst. to Jacob Harper in the sum of Forty seven Dollars and fifty cents, payable six months after date, therefore in consideration of the foregoing premises, and to secure the said Frederick White from any loss we the said Susan Albangle and John W Albangle do hereby bargain and sell to the said Frederick White the following property. Viz. One Broad Wheel Wagon, and stone bed, One Spring wagon and bed, One Swabster wagon and bed, One Car and gears One Brown horse, One Black horse, and one Bay Mare, three Milch Cows, eight Hogs, two sheep and three lambs, also a lot of grain now growing on the farm we reside on, supposed to be about thirty five acres more or less. ~ Provided that if we the said Susan Albangle and John W Albangle shall pay the aforesaid notes at maturity, with the interest thereon secured, by the said Frederick White as aforesaid, and shall also pay to the said Frederick White the aforesaid sum of One Hundred and twenty five dollars and ninety cents, and the interest thereon, at the end of said Nine Months from the date hereof, then these presents shall be void ~
