To the 6th Sub. ~ Deponent is acquainted with the lands whereof Solomon Forrest died seized and possessed ~ He owned the tract called "Foxes Chase", a tract called "Basket Ridge", a tract called "Hurdock's Inheritance", a tract called "The range about the three Miserable Knobs"

That the Exhibits from No 1 to No 8 inclusive and Exhibit A B describes accurately all the real estate of which the said Solomon Forrest died seized & possessed.

There is another tract of land called the range about the three Miserable Knobs and which is described in Exhibit No 1, supposed to contain about 30 or 40 Acres of land, and of which Solomon Forrest died seized and possessed, and which was purchased by said Solomon Forrest from David Wolfe deceased, but for which said Solomon Forrest never had a deed but held it by a Bond of Conveyance said Solomon Forrest bought at Sheriff's sale a tract of land called Stony Bottom, but that David Wolfe for whose land it was seized at the time had no title thereto said tract of land is described in Exhibit No. 3. ~

To the 7th Sub. ~ That said land cannot be divided among those interested without loss and injury thereto, because the lots are too small, the land of but an ordinary quality, and the heirs too numerous, and it would be greatly to the advantage of all the heirs that the lands should be sold and the proceeds divided. ~

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, and neither party desiring further time for the production of their evidences, the Commissioners closed the said Commission and herewith returned the same under their Hands and Seals this 21st day of June A.D. 1870. ~
