

The above cause standing ready for a hearing, and being submitted, the Bill Answer, Exhibits and Testimony and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered. ~

It is therefore this sixth day of September in the year Eighteen Hundred and Sixty nine, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the Authority thereof, adjudged Ordered, and decreed, that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold, for the purposes in the Bill in this cause, and that Messrs. Grayson Bickelberger and John Ritchie of Frederick County, be, and they are hereby appointed Trustees to make the said sales, and that the course and manner of their proceedings shall be as follows: ~

They shall first file in the Clerk's Office of this Court a Bond to the State of Maryland, executed by <sup>themselves</sup> with a Surety or Sureties, to be approved by the Court on the Clerk thereof, in the penalty of Six thousand Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in them by this Decree, or which may be reposed in them by any future order or decree in the premises. They shall then proceed to make sale of the said real estate, having first given at least three weeks previous notice of the time, place, manner and terms of sale; which terms shall be as follows: - One third of the purchase money to be paid on the day of sale, or on the ratification thereof by the Court the residue, in six and twelve months from the day of sale, the purchaser or purchasers giving his her or their notes, with approved security and bearing interest from the day of sale. ~ And as soon as may be convenient after
