And also writs of habere against George Kuhn of Montgomery County Maryland, Napoleon Kuhn of the City of Baltimore, and Harriet Kuhn of Frederick County Maryland, Commanding them and each of them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named, to answer the premises, and abide by and perform each decree as may be passed therein, and as in duty bound, your Complainant will ever pray. ~

This Indenture Made this Thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, between William Schley of the County of Frederick in the state of Maryland, of the one part, and William Kuhn of the County and state aforesaid of the other part. Whereas by a decree of Frederick's County Court, sitting as a Court of Chancery, the above named William Schley was appointed a Trustee to make sale of the real estate of the late Francis Jarboe deceased, and authorized and empowered upon payment of all the purchase money, to convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof as will particularly appear upon reference to said decree bearing date the fifth day of October in the year 1826 passed and made in Case No 87 on the docket of said Court. ~

And whereas the said William Schley in pursuance of said decree, did on the second day of February in the year 1828, make sale of the lots and premises as below mentioned to the said William Kuhn, at and for the sum of Eighty dollars current money, which sale was afterwards duly ratified and confirmed by the Court aforesaid, and whereas, said purchase money has been fully satisfied and paid to the said William Schley by the said William Kuhn. ~

Now therefore this Indenture Witnesseth that the said William Schley in consideration of the premises, and of the further sum of five Dollars current money to him in hand paid, hath granted, bargained and sold and doth hereby grant, bargain and sell, alien, and confirm, to the said William Kuhn his heirs and assigns forever, all those two lots of ground and premises lying and being in the Town of Berlin, in the County aforesaid
