The Bill states that a certain William Kuhn now deceased, in his life time, by his single Bill dated on the 8th of December 1869 - was indebted to William Graham in the sum of One hundred dollars with interest from date - And that to secure the payment of said single Bill, the said William Kuhn executed his Mortgage on the Lot situate on First Street in the Town of Berlin in Frederick County, State of Maryland. ~

The Bill further states that William Kuhn died sometime during the month of June or July 1870 - unmarried, without issue and intestate as to his real estate - Which real estate descended to his brother and sisters and to the Children of deceased brothers and sisters - viz ~

- 1 George Kuhn, only child of Christian Kuhn, a deceased brother of intestate.
- 2 J. Napoleon Kuhn, only child of John Kuhn, a deceased brother of intestate.
- 3 J. Peter Kuhn a brother who resided in Ohio, whether living or dead, or if dead, whether he left issue or not, is unknown. ~
- 4 Jacob Kuhn, a brother of intestate
- 5 Frank Kuhn a brother formerly a resident of the State of Florida, and whether living or dead is unknown - not having been heard of for twenty years. ~
- 6 Elizabeth Winter a sister, now the wife of Jacob Winter. ~

7 Harrieh Kuhn ~

The Bill further states, that the said sum of One hundred dollars is still due, owing and unpaid, by said William Kuhn in his life time, or by any other person in his behalf, since his death, although the time for the payment thereof has elapsed ~ And that Peter Kuhn or his unknown heirs - Frank Kuhn Jacob Kuhn, Elizabeth Winter and Jacob Winter her husband, are now residents of the State of Maryland. ~

It is therefore this 19th day of July in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy, Ordered that the complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some Newspaper published at Frederick, once a week for four successive weeks before the twenty fifth day of August 1870 - give notice to the said absent defendants of the object and substance of this Bill, and warn them to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor, on or before the twenty eighth day of November 1870, to answer the premises and show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed. ~

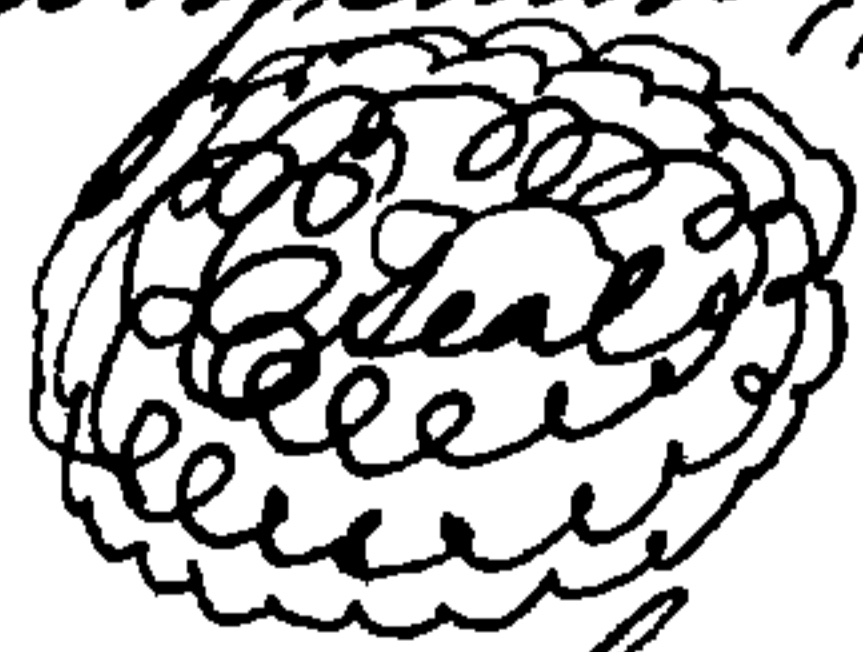
