To the 3rd Sub. ~ He died the 2nd day of July, in the year 1840. ~

To the 4th Sub. ~ He died without wife or children; ~

To the 5th Sub. ~ He left a nephew George, son of Abraham Kuku, who is dead, George Kuku had sisters, but nothing has been heard of them for a number of years. ~

Napoleon, a son of John Kuku, who is dead, is living, the last I heard of him he was in Baltimore. ~ Peter Kuku I don't know whether he is living or dead, I have not heard of him for many years. ~ Jacob Kuku, a brother, who moved to the west, died there, leaving several children, I don't know whether dead or alive, I have not heard of them for a long time. ~ Frank Kuku, a brother, who was a Lieutenant in the Florida War, has not been heard from for thirty years. ~

Elizabeth Winter, a sister, married to Jacob Winter, lives in Missouri. ~ Harriet, a sister, now living, in Berlin, Frederick County Maryland. All the parties I speak of, are of full age. ~

To the 6th Sub. ~ I look at Exhibits No 2 & 3, I know the property, they embrace the property owned by William Kuku ~ It is situated on 8th street in Berlin, Kuku was in possession of it at the date of his Mortgage, and the time of his death. ~

To the 7th & 8th Subs. ~ Sworn as to this Witness. ~

Joseph Goodman, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainant, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioners by the Complainant; Solicitor, and herewith returned, deposes and says. ~
