Remsburg to file their claims duly proven, with the clerk of this court, on or before a certain day, and that they may have such other and further relief in the premises as the nature of the case may require, and to your Honors may seem just. Your Petitioners will ever pray &c.

This Deed made this sixth day of February in the year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy One by me George P. Remsburg, of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, Witnesseth, that whereas I the said George P. Remsburg being indebted to sundry parties in several sums of money and unable to pay the same in full, have proposed and agreed to assign all my property unto Wm. H. Kemp and Geo. W. Corum of said County and State in trust for the benefit of my creditors as hereinafter named, Now Therefore, I the said Geo. P. Remsburg in consideration of the promises, and in further consideration of One Dollar, to me in hand paid, do grant unto the said Wm. H. Kemp and Geo. W. Corum as Trustees, the following property, that is to say, the stock in trade, household goods furniture, implements, debts, sums of money, books of accounts, and all the personal Estate of me the said George P. Remsburg, and also all other property of me the said Geo. P. Remsburg, of every kind and description, except such as is exempt from Execution by Law, to have hold and take the same upon trust, that he the said Wm. H. Kemp and Geo. W.
