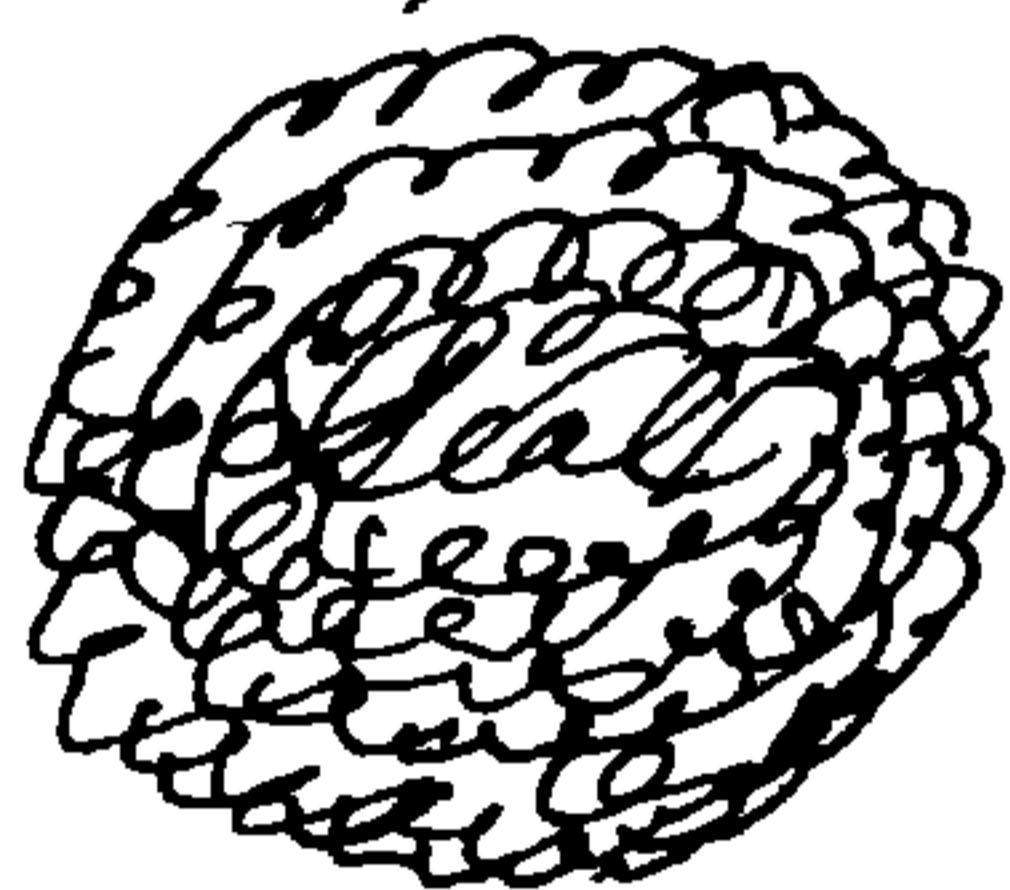

Urner, Assignee as aforesaid, all the Estate, Real and personal of the said Frederick Gunstern, Bankrupt, including all Property, of whatever kind, of which he is possessed, or in which he was interested, or entitled to have, on the Fifteenth day of February, A.D. One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy One, together with all his deeds, Books and papers relating thereto, saving and excepting such property as is exempted from the operation of this assignment by the provisions of said Fourteenth Section of said act. To Have and to Hold, all the foregoing premises to the said Milton G. Urner, and to his heirs forever. ~ In Trust, Nevertheless for the use and purposes, and with the powers, and subject to the conditions and limitations prescribed and set forth in said Act. ~
