Complainant, being duly sworn, and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioners by the Complainant, and herewith returned, deposes and says. ~

To the 1st Sub. That he is acquainted with all the parties to this suit, and has known them several years. ~

To the 2nd Sub. That he was acquainted with Charles E. Thomas, mentioned in the interrogatory, that he is dead - That he died in the Month of March in the year 1869, at his residence in Frederick County. ~

To the 3rd Sub. That the said Charles E. Thomas was married at the time of his death - That his widow is Mrs. Eliza Jane Thomas, one of the Defendants in this suit, who resides on the farm of said Charles E. Thomas in Frederick County.

To the 4th Sub. ~ That the said Charles E. Thomas did leave children - That their names are David O. Thomas, who is over twenty one years of age, Emma B. Thomas who is about nineteen years of age - Maggie O. Thomas, who is about seventeen years of age - Charles E. Thomas, who is about 10 years of age - Willie Thomas who is about thirteen years of age. - Harriet E. Thomas who is about eleven years of age - and Eliza J. Thomas, who is about seven years of age - and that they all reside in Frederick County in the State of Maryland. ~

To the 5th Sub. ~ That he is acquainted with the lands of which said Charles E. Thomas died seized and possessed, and that said lands are described in Exhibits 1 and 2, filed in this cause, and now shown to witness. ~

To the 6th Sub. ~ That said lands cannot be divided amongst the children and heirs at law of Charles E. Thomas, without injury and loss to them ~ That said lands do not lie so as to be susceptible of division advantageously, into so many parts, and therefore, such division would lessen their value. ~

D^o Lloyd T. Duvall, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainant, being duly sworn, and examined to the interrogatories aforesaid, deposes and says ~

To the 1st Sub. That he is acquainted with all the parties to this suit, and has known them several years; ~

To the 2nd Sub. ~ That he was acquainted with Charles E. Thomas, mentioned in the interrogatory - That he is dead, That he died in the month of March A.D. 1869, at his residence in Frederick County

To the 3rd Sub. - That said Charles E. Thomas was married at the time of his death That his widow is Mrs. Eliza J. Thomas, one of the Defendants in this suit, and that she resides at the former residence of said Charles E. Thomas in Frederick County. ~

To the 4th Sub. That Charles E. Thomas did leave children, that their names are David O. Thomas, who is over twenty one years of age, Emma B. Thomas who is about nineteen years of age - Maggie O. Thomas, who is about seventeen years, Charles E. Thomas who is between fourteen and fifteen years of age, Willie Thomas who is between twelve and thirteen years of age - Harriet E. Thomas who is between ten and eleven years of age, and Eliza J. Thomas, who is between seven and eight years of age - and that they all reside in Frederick County in the State of Maryland. ~

To the 5th Interrogatory ~ That he is acquainted with the lands of which said Charles E. Thomas died seized and possessed, except the Wood Lot. That Dapneah looks at the said Exhibits No 1 and No 2, and that said lands are described in said Exhibits, that is, all of said lands except the wood lot which may or may not be therein described - As witness is not acquainted with said Wood Lot. ~

To the 6th Interrogatory - That he does not think said Land could
