To the Honorable the Judges of the Fifth Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland, sitting in the Circuit Court for Frederick County in Equity. ~
The Bill of Complaint of Maria C. Carroll of Frederick County State of Maryland shows. That Mary Ellen Horsey in her lifetime was indebted to your Complainant in the sum of Four Thousand two hundred and fifty dollars, for money loaned by your Complainant, to the said Mary Ellen Horsey, in her lifetime which sum of money, with interest from the first day of January in the year Eighteen hundred and Seventy, is still due, owing and unpaid. ~
Your Complainant further states that said Mary Ellen Horsey, died on or about the Seventeenth day of August, in the year Eighteen hundred and Seventy having first made and Executed in due form of Law, a last will and testament, duly executed to pass real estate. ~
Your Complainant further states that said Mary Ellen Horsey by her said last Will devised her lands in Frederick County, to her brother Outerbridge Horsey for and during his life, and after his death, to her nephew, George Carroll Horsey, during his life, and after his death, to his Oldest son then living in fee simple, and in the event of the death of said George Carroll Horsey, without children or grand children then living, to her Niece Mary Ellen Horsey in fee simple, and in the event of her death, before she attains legal age, then to her niece Eliza Lee Horsey in fee simple. ~
Your Complainant further states that the said Mary Ellen Horsey, by her will, bequeathed to her Niece Eliza Lee Mitchell, the sum of two hundred dollars per annum in each and every year during her life - And which annuity the said Mary Ellen Horsey, the Testatrix charged upon her lands in Frederick County, and subjected them to the payment thereof. ~
