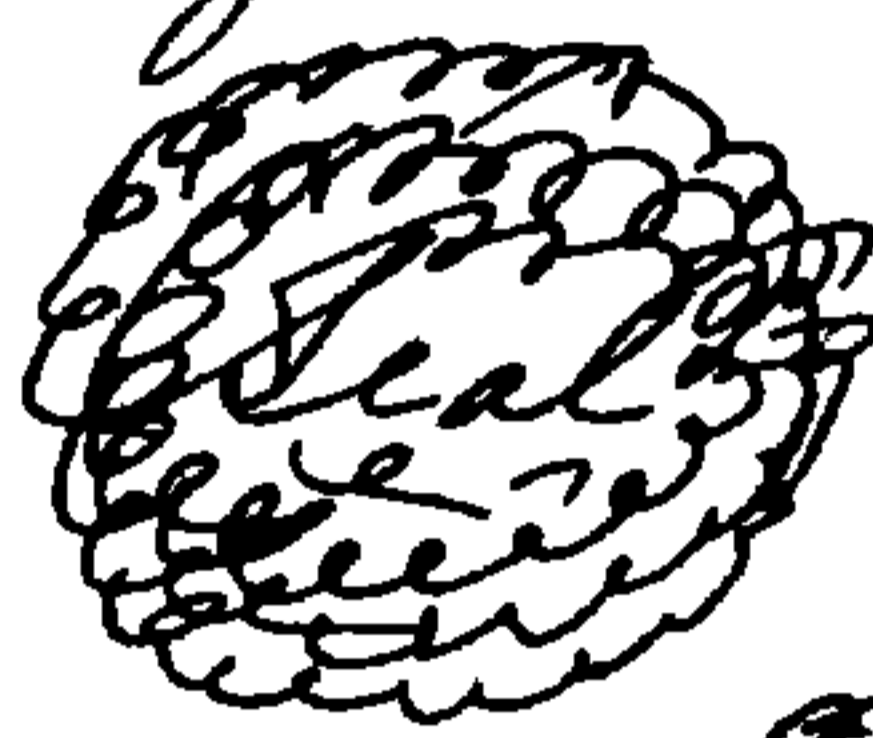

The Codicil to the last Will and Testament of Eliza D. Horsey,
Frederick County State of Maryland. ~

The value of the parcel of negroes devised to my daughter and son
having become unequal, I desire to change that portion of my Will, and do
now devise to my daughter Mary Ellen the following, servants viz. Lloyd,
Alec, Jack, Isaac, William the son of Maria, Rachael, Anney, Julian, &
Leanna Lewis, to my son Outerbridge the following, negroes viz. Henry,
Frank, Moses, William, Mary, Nancy, Sally, Susan, David Thomas.

And whereas I have devised to my son and his heirs the land on
which the Distillery and Hog pens have been built at his own expenses
and with my permission, and with the understanding that he should
have the land on which the Cooper's Shop and the Distillers House
or any other out house necessary to the carrying on the Distillery may
stand. ~

And whereas, I have devised the portion of land on which my
house and farm improvements are now located, to my daughter, her
heirs, and directed that she should pay my son \$500 for the value
of the improvements - Now, I hereby revoke said provision, and give
my daughter the house and improvements discharged from said sum
of \$500. and I give to my son, his Executors Administrators and assigns,
all the stock of farming utensils and personal property of every kind
except the servants and Silver, and the Crops of grain growing or grown
sown, which may be on the farm or pertaining thereto at the time of
my decease. ~ And whereas the sum of \$500 directed to be paid my
son by my daughter for the house and improvements, would be inadequate
to remunerate him for the loss thereof, I therefore do devise to him the above
articles. I do further devise that all the negroes and the money devised
to the said Trustees in said will mentioned for the benefit of my grand daughter
Eliza Lee Mitchell, shall be held by said Trustees on the survivor of them
