

Sunkle - And in the event of the death of the said George Carroll Horsey without children or grand children then living, to her niece Mary Ella Horsey, in fee simple, and in the event of her death before she attains legal age, then to her niece Eliza Lee Horsey. And by said last will, bequeathed to her niece Eliza Lee Mitchell the sum of Two Hundred dollars per Annum, in each and every year during her life - Which Annuity is charged upon the land in Frederick County, and subjected them to the payment thereof - And by said Will constituted and appointed Outerbridge Horsey residuary legatee and executor thereof.

The Bill further states that the said Mary Ellen Horsey, died as aforesaid without having revoked said Will, and that letters testamentary were granted to the said Outerbridge Horsey.

The Bill further states that the said Mary Ellen Horsey at the time of her death was seized in fee of one undivided moiety of all those lands situate in Frederick County State of Maryland, formerly the Estate of her Mother Mrs. Eliza D. Horsey, and devised to the said Mary Ellen Horsey and others, by the last will and testament of the said Mrs. Eliza D. Horsey.

The Bill further states that the personal estate of the said Mary Ellen Horsey is wholly insufficient for the payment of her debts, and that a sale of the real estate whereof said Mary Ellen Horsey died seized and possessed, will be necessary for the payment of her debts.

The Bill further states that George Carroll Horsey, Eliza Lee Horsey, and Mary Ellen Horsey are infants under the age of twenty one years, and that George Carroll Horsey now resides in the City of Paris, France, without the limits of the United States, and beyond the reach of the process of this Court.

It is thereupon this 30<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy, Ordered that the Complainant, by causing a Copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper published at Frederick County once in each week for one month before - second day of January 1871, give notice to the said absent defendant of the object and substance of this bill, and warn him to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor on or before the tenth day of April in the year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy one, to answer the premises and show cause if any he has, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.

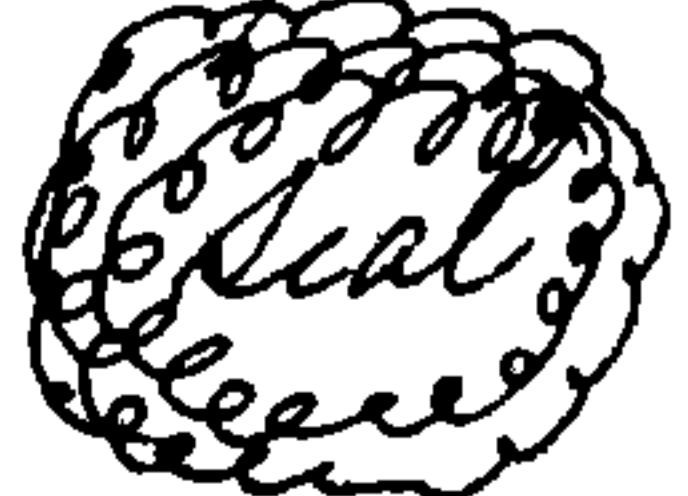
