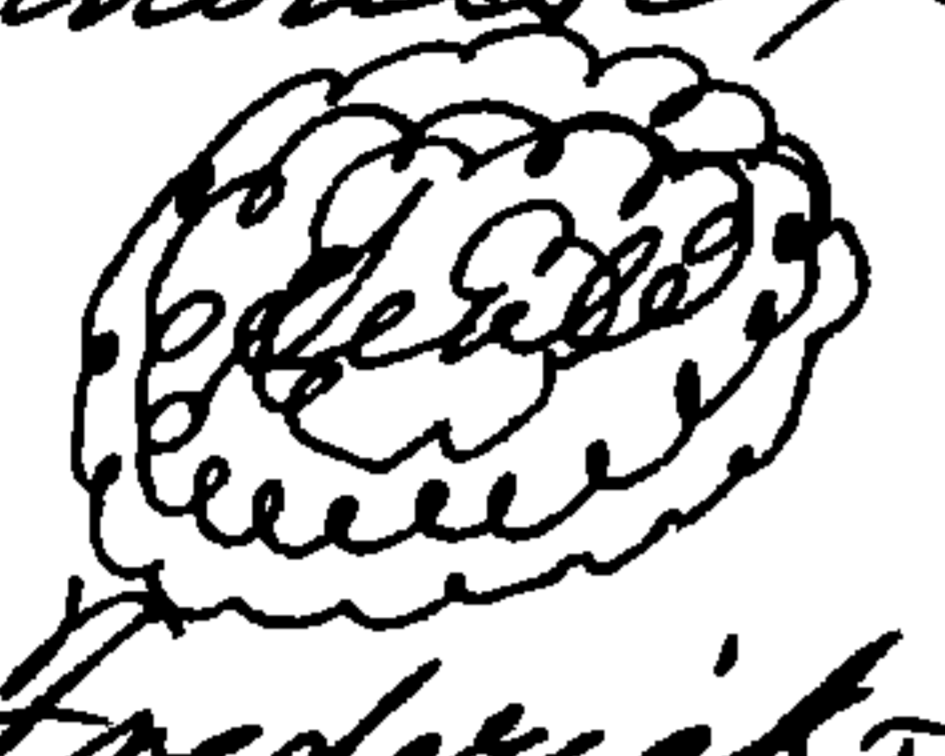

State of Maryland, To The Sheriff of Frederick County. Greeting.

Whereas at a Circuit Court, begun and held at the Court House in Frederick town, in and for said County, on the second Monday of May last, a certain Louis F. Detrick, by a judgment of the same Court, recovered against a certain David P. Griffiths as well the sum of Two hundred and forty seven dollars and Nineteen Cents, current money, a certain Debt, with interest from the Fifth day of May 1869 until paid; as the sum of Seven dollars and seventy cents for his costs and charges by him about his suit in that behalf, paid out and expended.

Whereof the said David P. Griffiths is Compt as it appears of record. ~ Therefore you are hereby Comanded, that of the goods and Chattles, lands and tenements of the said David P. Griffiths, being in your bailiwick, you cause to be made the Debt and interest, Costs and Charges aforesaid, and have you those sums before the Judges of the next Circuit Court for Frederick County to be held at the Court House in Frederick town, in and for said County, on the second Monday of December next, to render unto the said Louis F. Detrick the debt and interest, Costs and Charges aforesaid. ~

Hereof, fail not, at your peril, and have you then and there this writ. Witness, the Honorable Madison Nelson, Chief Judge of the said Court, the 20th day of September 1869. ~

Detrick and for Officer's fees. ~
