

to said Louis F. Detrick as a Commission Merchant in Baltimore, for sale, 105 sacks of Sumac and One hundred and one sacks of Bark, which remained unsold, from distress in the Market and want of buyers when your Receiver was appointed. ~

That your Receiver directed said Louis F. Detrick to sell the same in the usual and most advantageous manner; and said Detrick after much effort, finally sold 84 bags or sacks of the Sumac weighing 5 ³⁹²/₂₅₀ tons @ \$40 per ton, \$218.971, and the 101 sacks of Bark weighing 6 ²²⁶/₂₅₀ tons @ \$15 per ton = \$96.20, making a total of \$315.17, to Ramsburg and Sons of Georgetown D.C., from which total, said Detrick deducted for drayage, storage, commissions &c. \$93.91, leaving a balance of \$221.26, which he has paid to your Receiver; All which will appear by reference to the account of said sale of said Detrick herewith filed as Exhibit No 5

That 21 Sacks of said Sumac, of inferior quality, still remains unsold in the hands of said Detrick, for want of buyers, and is but of little value, but will be sold as soon as practicable. ~ And your Receiver further shows that there are charges on the books of said firm, against said Griffiths and Mason individually, but as they have filed claims in larger amounts against the partnership, about which they disagree, your Receiver awaits the audit in this case for the proper adjustment thereof - All which is respectfully submitted.
