That said William S. Wolfe in his life time, was indebted to Lewis W. Wolfe on Judgment recorded in the Court of Common Pleas for the City of Baltimore at the suit of George S. Borman, for the sum of \$ 259 and costs, which judgment was dated on the 21<sup>st</sup> February 1861, and entered to the use of said Lewis W. Wolf on the 20<sup>th</sup> March 1864, as well appear by a certified copy of said Judgment herewith Exhibited, marked Exhibit No 1. which with all other Exhibits herein after produced, your Complainant prays may be taken as part of this Bill of Complaint.

Your Complainant further charges that Solomon W. Penn, Henry R. Racquet, Dan Camp, Bush, William M. Hurty, Jesse Fitzgerald and Horace F. Penn recovered Judgment in the Court of Common Pleas for the City of Baltimore against said William S. Wolf for the sum of \$ 133. Damages, with interest, which judgment was entered to the use of the Complainant the said Lewis W. Wolfe, as will appear by a short Copy of said Judgment duly certified Marked Exhibit No 2. ~

Your Complainant further charges that the said William S. Wolfe in his life time was indebted to said Complainant in sundry promissory notes, One dated June 1<sup>st</sup> 1857 at Eighteen Months for \$ 62.26, one dated June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1859 at 9 Months for \$ 336.32, One dated Feb. 7<sup>th</sup> 1859 at 9 Months for \$ 192.25, in three notes each for \$ 174.90, all dated March 27<sup>th</sup> 1860, respectively at Seven, Eight and Nine Months after date, all of which will more fully appear by the said promissory notes herewith Exhibited Marked Exhibits No 3, 4, 5, 6 7 and 8. ~

Which said Judgments and Notes are still due, owing and unpaid. ~

Your Complainant further states that the said William S. Wolf, in his life time was seized in fee (subject to the life Estate of Adam Wolfe) of one undivided Eighth part in and to all those Lots or parts of Lots of ground, situate lying and being in Frederick City Frederick County State of Maryland which descended to him as one of the Children and heirs at Law of Caroline Wolfe now deceased, as daughter and as Co-heir with Rebecca Sluss, of Ludwig Wetzheimer late of said County and State of Maryland decd who died intestate, part of which said Lots were assigned to said Caroline Wolfe by Commissioners appointed under the Act to direct descents, as her portion of the Estate of said Ludwig Wetzheimer, to be held in severalty, and part thereof was assigned to Ann Margaret Wetzheimer widow of said Ludwig Wetzheimer as and for her dower, and which Lots upon her death descended to Rebecca Steiner, and the said Caroline Wolfe the heirs at Law of said Ludwig Wetzheimer, and one undivided moiety of which Lots upon the death of Caroline Wolfe, descended to her children as her heirs at law, of whom the said William S. Wolfe is one, he being entitled to one undivided Eighth of the real Estate whereof said Caroline Wolfe died seized & possessed subject to the life estate of Adam Wolfe husband of said Caroline Wolfe, and which Lots and parts of Lots of ground are fully described in the return made by Robert Mc Cleary, George Struck, John Mc Donald, Jacob Brummer and John Englebrecht Commissioners appointed under the Act to direct descents, to value and divide the Real Estate of said Ludwig Wetzheimer - A certified Copy of which return is herewith Exhibited Marked Exhibit L. Your Complainant further states that the said William S. Wolfe died intestate in the month of May in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy One, seized in fee of one undivided Eighth part of all those Lots and parts of Lots situate in Frederick City County of Frederick State of Maryland described in Exhibit L. W. W. in this Bill, of which his Mother Caroline Wolfe deceased, died seized and possessed, subject to the tenancy by curtesy of Adam Wolfe, husband of the said Caroline Wolfe. ~
