

among other bequests and devises, gave and bequeathed to his two Sons Daniel Hillside and William Hillside, the Farm on which Daniel Heller the son of Daniel Heller then resided, containing about 11 1/2 Acres of Land more or less, after the said Daniel Heller's lease shall expire, which will be on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April 1837. &c &c "My two sons Daniel and William Hillside is to have all the rents arising from said Farm during the lease of said Daniel Heller, After which I bequeath to my son Daniel Hillside, the one half of said Farm during his natural life only, then the said one half is to be equally divided between his Children lawfully begotten of his body. The other one half I give and bequeath to my son William Hillside" all of which will fully and at large appear by Reference to the last will and testament of said Conrad Hillside, a Certified Copy of which is herewith exhibited, marked Exhibit No. 1 which your Complainants pray together with all other Exhibits hereinafter produced may be taken as part of this their Bill of Complaint.

Your Complainants further allege and charge that William Hillside filed his Bill of Complaint in your Honorable Court known as Bill No 1754 Equity on the Equity Docket of your Honorable Court against the said Daniel Hillside and others, praying for a partition of the lands devised by said Conrad Hillside by his last will and testament to said William Hillside and to Daniel Hillside for and during his natural life only, and after his death to be equally divided amongst his children, and that a Commission is issued by your Honorable Court appointing Joseph Bechelberger Daniel Heller and others, Commissioners to view, walk over, and divide the lands aforesaid devised into two Equal parts, that said Commissioners do meet and divide the aforementioned Farm into two Equal parts, and did allot assign and lay off Lot No 2 to the said William Hillside and did allot assign and lay off Lot No 1. to Daniel Hillside and others - Said Lot No 1. being part of a tract of land called "Weaver's Weave Stool" particularly described by course and distance, containing seventy nine Acres of land, in the return of said Commissioners filed in No 1754 Equity a Certified Copy of which is herewith Exhibited Marked Exhibit No. 2.

Your Complainants further state that Daniel Hillside the tenant for life in Lot No 1. described as aforesaid, in the month of February in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty, leaving the following children, viz:

- 1<sup>st</sup> John W. Hillside Married to Anna North one of your Complainants.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Caroline Hillside, now the wife Thos W. Eyer, one of your Complainants.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Jane C. Hillside who married Daniel C. Hillside, and did during the lifetime of her said Father the tenant for life leaving two children her heirs at law - to whom the interest of the said Jane C. Hillside descended.

Sarah Ida Hillside - and George W. Hillside both of whom are infants under the age of twenty one years, and reside in Frederick's County.

4<sup>th</sup> Conrad Hillside married to Harriet Wolfe, one of your Complainants - 5<sup>th</sup> Simon Hillside Married to Catharine Hillian, one of your Complainants.

6<sup>th</sup> Edward C. Hillside, Married to Prudence Ilev, one of your Complainants.

7<sup>th</sup> Mary C. Hillside married to James Coil, and who died in the lifetime of her said Father the tenant for life, leaving three children her heirs at law, to whom the interest of the said Mary C. Coil descended.
