

He is not to pay any part of the legacies until after the expiration of Twelve Months from the time of my death, and not then without he has a sufficiency to make a good dividend, as I do not want my Executor to hurry my lands into market for the sake of paying off the legacies, but to sell to the best advantage, and pay the legacies in dividends as the payments become due. If my real Estate and personal property should not hold out to pay the full amount of my Debts and Legacies, my Executor after paying my debts, must deduct from the Amount of Each Heir's share in proportion to the Amount left them, and in case there should be more than enough to pay my debts and the legacies, then it is my will that the same shall be equally divided among my children. ~

Item - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Rider the sum of Six hundred Dollars.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Grand Son Ruben Weller the son of Mary Rider the sum of One hundred Dollars

Item - I give and bequeath to my Grand Son John Weller the son of Mary Rider the sum of One hundred Dollars. ~

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Dear Son Joseph Willhede to be sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, revoking and annulling all former Wills by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and some other to be my last Will and Testament. ~

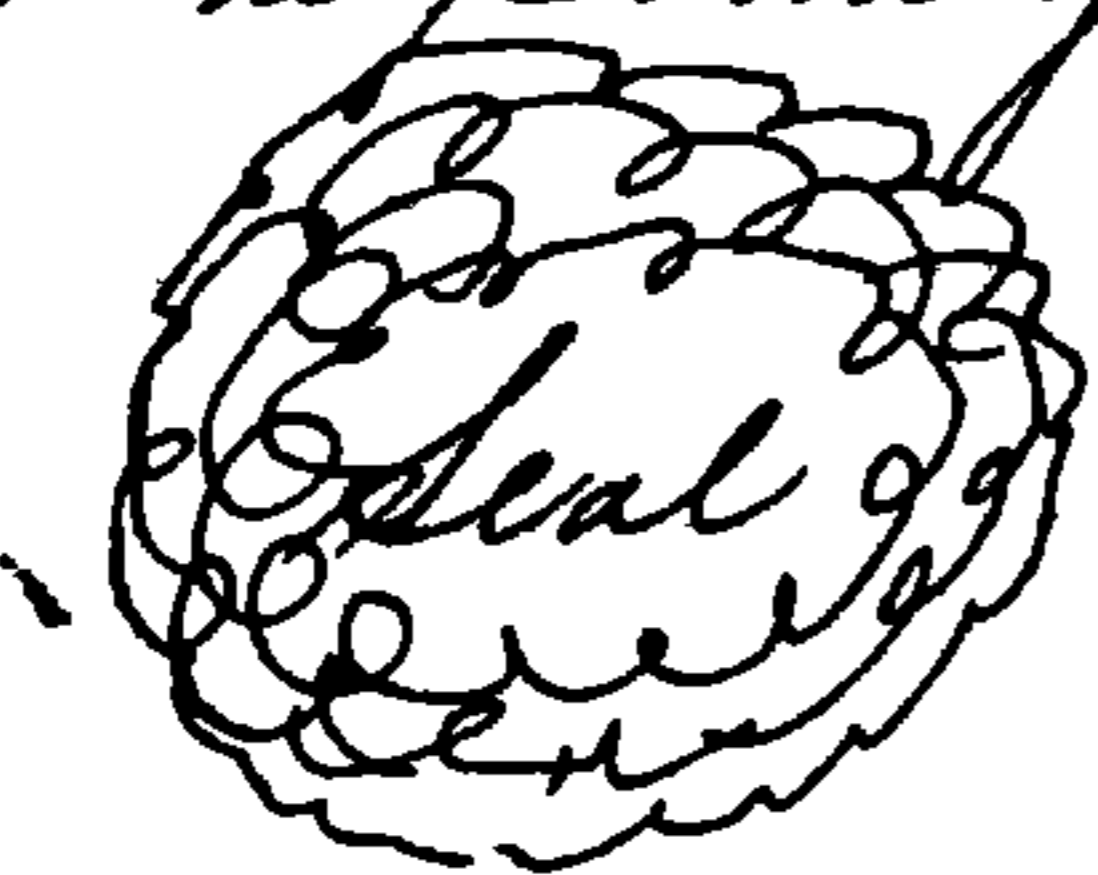
