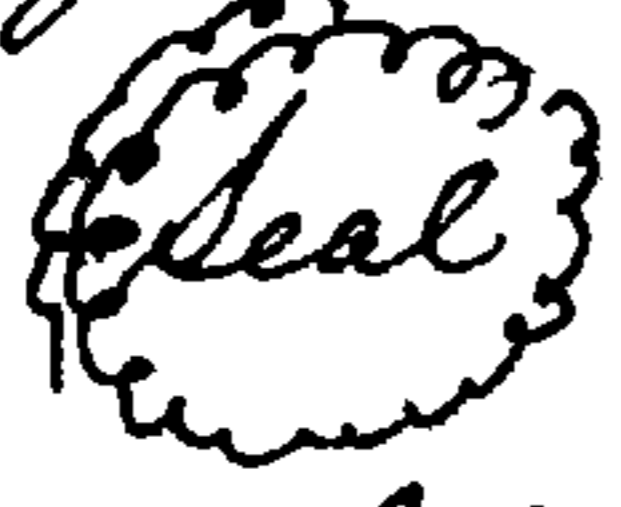


Subpoena Maryland, Feb:

You are hereby commanded that all expenses set apart, you personally appear before the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity, to be held at the Court House in Frederick town and for said County, on the second Monday of May next, to answer the Bill and Complaint of Parmalee Feizer by her next friend John W. Shank, against you in said Court Exhibited, and so forth. ~

Hereof fail you not, as you will answer the contrary at your peril Witness the Honorable William P. Maulsby, Chief Judge of our said Court, the 20th day of February 1871

Answer of Phoebe E Feizer ~

The Answer of Phoebe E Feizer, Widow of Jacob Feizer, late of Frederick County deceased, to the Bill of Complaint of Parmalee Feizer, by John W. Shank his next friend, filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County against herself and others. ~

This Respondent admits the several matters and things stated in said Bill of Complaint to be true as therein stated, and agrees that a Decree may be passed in the premises, as to this Court may seem Equitable. ~

This Defendant agrees to a sale of the Mill Property - The Wood Lot and the School House property described in said Bill of Complaint, free of her dower as widow of said Jacob Feizer, upon receiving her due proportion of the proceeds of sale of sale thereof, in lieu of her dower, as allowed by the rules of Court - And agrees that the farm mentioned and described in said Bill may be sold under and by virtue of a Decree to be passed by your Honorable Court subject to her dower right therein which dower she claims. ~

I Phoebe E. Feizer widow of Jacob Feizer, late of said County deceased, do hereby agree that the Mill Property, Wood Lot and School House property of the said deceased, shall be sold under and by virtue of a Decree to be passed by the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity, free from the incumbrance of my dower therein, and that in lieu thereof I will accept such proportion of the proceeds of sale of said herein before mentioned real Estate as the Court shall Judge to be reasonable - And claim my Dower in the farm mentioned and described in said proceedings, agreeing to a sale thereof, subject to my dower therein ~ Phoebe E Feizer
