of our Lord, One thousand Eight hundred and Twenty one, came the said Elizabeth  
Loy and others into Court here sitting as a Court of Equity, and filed there  
by their Attorneys George H. Shellman & J. K. Wood Esqrs, the following Bill  
with the Exhibits therein mentioned.

Bill

To the Honorable, The Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County  
as a Court of Equity.

The Bill of Complaint of Elizabeth Loy, Levi Ouelman, and Julia Ouelman  
his wife, William Ouelman and Hannah Ouelman his wife, David Ouelman  
and Elizabeth Ouelman, his wife, John Ouelman and Emma L. Ouelman,  
his wife, Mary L. Ouelman and Hannah Ouelman, respectfully shews  
that some time in the month of \_\_\_\_\_ in the year 1870, a certain Joseph Ouel-  
man late of Frederick County, departed this life intestate, leaving the follow-  
ing heirs at law viz.

Your complainant Elizabeth Loy, who is a sister of said Joseph Ouelman  
dec'd. - and an unmarried widow - Elizabeth Ouelman, the Defendant,  
a niece of said Joseph and daughter of William Ouelman, a deceased  
brother of said Joseph, who is unmarried and a lunatic and resides  
in Green castle Franklin County Pennsylvania - And your complain-  
ants Levi Ouelman, William Ouelman, David Ouelman, and John Ouelman  
who are all nephews of said Joseph, and sons of said William Ouelman  
dec'd. - And your complainants Mary L. Ouelman and Hannah Ouel-  
man who are grand-nieces of said Joseph and the children of a deceased  
son of said William Ouelman dec'd. and who are of minor age - All  
of which said parties are heirs at law of said Joseph dec'd. - are over  
the age of twenty one years.

And your complainants further shew unto your Honors that the  
said Joseph Ouelman dec'd. dec'd seized and possessed in fee simple  
of a house and lot of ground in the town of Emmittsburg in Frederick  
County aforesaid, which is more fully described in a certified Copy of  
a deed from Joseph Brown and wife to said intestate, filed herewith  
marked Exhibit "A" and which together with all other Exhibits, your  
complainants pray may be taken as a part of this their Bill of Complaint,

And your complainants further charge that the aforesaid heirs  
of Joseph Ouelman dec'd. - are seized and possessed of the aforesaid  
real Estate as tenants in common, and that the aforesaid real Estate  
is not susceptible of division, without great loss and disadvantage to  
those entitled to the same, and that it would be to the advantage of all  
the parties interested, the lunatic as well as all the rest, that said real  
Estate be sold, and the proceeds divided amongst them in proportion
