

A Represents the beginning of the parcel for 137 Acres, conveyed by J. W. Hammond to Thomas Clayett, 26th May 1848, thence on yellow shaded lines Nos. 1. 2 3 4 5 6 7 Back to A. ~

C Represents the beginning of the deed from Thomas Clayett and wife to Josiah L. Warrenfelz. ~

The broken line shaded Blue drawn from B to C, represents the divisional line across the whole parcel for 137 Acres, as expressed in the deed from Thomas Clayett and wife to Josiah L. Warrenfelz. ~

The Broken line not shaded drawn from D to E, represents the divisional line made between Warrenfelz and Easterdays by the first survey. ~

The Broken line shaded Red drawn from F to G, represents the divisional line across the said 137 acres as claimed and located for Easterdays ~
