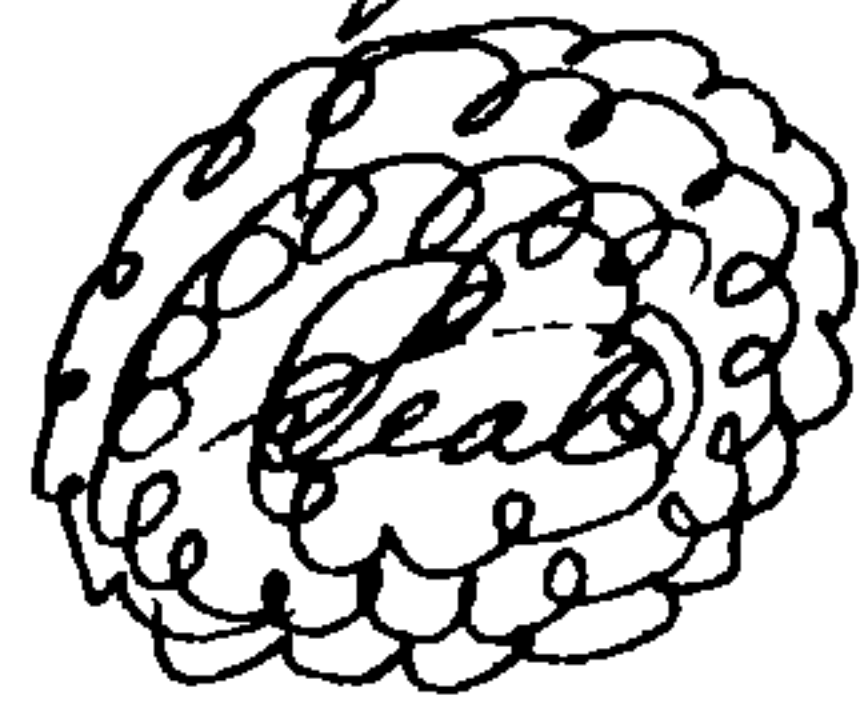

Complaining shows your Orator, Casper W. Wever, of Washington County, that the General Assembly of Maryland (by Act of the December Session of the year 1834, Chapter 144, to which was passed a Supplement, of 1836 Chapter 309) created a certain Corporation, styled "The Weavertown Manufacturing Company", which became duly organized and went into operation after large subscriptions to the Capital Stock thereof; and acquired a very extensive Real Estate in Frederick County in Maryland, and also Real Estate in Washington County, and in Virginia, with valuable water powers and Mill seats. —

And your Orator states that he became a large stockholder in said Corporation, and more by Original Subscription and by subsequent acquisition for claims against said Corporation for monies paid by him for it and otherwise is a Stockholder of said Corporation to extent of Two Hundred and Twenty one shares and a right which he may avail himself of, to Five Thousand more. —

And your Orator further states and charges, that he is also a creditor of said Corporation to an amount of more than Fifteen Thousand Dollars, for which said amount
