

Complaint in said Court against said Chapman, and The Haverston Manufacturing Company.

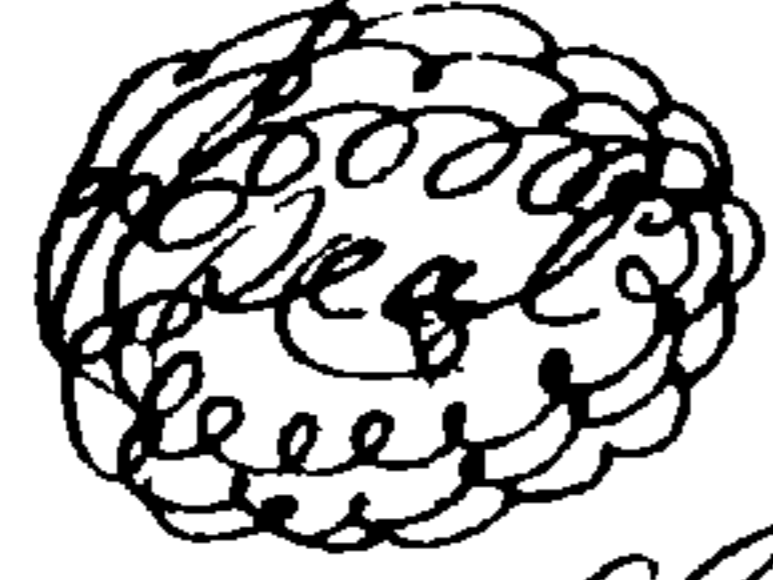
Now the condition of the above obligation is such, that if said Caspar W Wener his Executors or Administrators, shall prosecute said Writ of Injunction with effect, and shall satisfy and pay, said Chapman, his Executors, Administrators and assigns, all costs, charges, and damages, that shall accrue to said Chapman; his Executors, or Administrators or assigns, in the said Circuit Court or elsewhere, or be occasioned by the said injunction; unless the said Circuit Court, or any other Court shall decree to the contrary, and shall in all things obey such Order and decree as said Circuit Court, or any other Court shall make in the premises, then the above obligation to be of none effect, else to be in full force and virtue.

To the Honorable the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity

Humly Complaining sheweth unto this Honorable Court your Orator Caspar W Wener of Washington County, that on or about the Seventeenth day of October in the year 1857, the Haverston Manufacturing Company was seized in fee of a tract of land or part of a tract of land called "Haverston" lying and being in Frederick County in the State of Maryland, together with all and singular the rights, privileges and appurtenances, darts, ways, water courses and sluices whether situated in Frederick County aforesaid or Washington County aforesaid. And your Orator further sheweth, that on the same day the said Haverston Manufacturing Company was indebted to him in the aggregate sum of Fifteen Thousand two hundred and forty dollars lawful money, two thousand two hundred and twenty dollars, whereof, was to be paid to your Orator in one year after the
