This Indenture made this 12<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year Eighteen Hundred and  
fifty two, between The Henderson Steel and Pile Manufacturing Company of Weverton, Maryland  
of the one part and Henry W. Davis Trustee of the other part: Witnesses, That Archibald  
Henderson of Washington City, having advanced and loaned or become responsible for  
large sums of Money for and on account of the said parties of the first part, amounting  
to about the sum of Twelve thousand dollars with the interest thereon, due or to become due,  
the particulars of which advances and responsibilities will more fully appear from the  
Books and papers of said Company, and the notes and evidences of debt given for such ad-  
vances and loans - And said Company being desirous and having resolved to secure  
said Archibald Henderson on all their property and stock in trade, real and personal.  
The parties of the first part, in consideration of the premises, and of five dollars to  
them paid by the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,  
have granted, bargained and sold, aliened, released, and confirmed and do by these  
presents, grant, convey, release and confirm to the party of the second part, all  
the following property - All that parcel of ground situated in the Town  
of Weverton, in Frederick County, Maryland, and bounded as follows; -

Beginning at a point in the South line of Factory Street three hundred feet  
Westwardly from the West line of the land conveyed, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January  
1850, to the Potomac Manufacturing Company, and running thence with  
said South line, one hundred and fifty feet Westwardly - then by a line parallel  
with the said West line of the Potomac Manufacturing Company to the North side  
of the Contemplated general lot (see) - then with said North side Eastwardly  
until another line drawn parallel with the said West line will run to the beginning,  
and then with such line to the beginning containing Thirty thousand square feet of land  
more or less, together with all the Water power and privileges now held by the said  
party of the first part, under their deed from the Weverton Manufacturing  
Company of the 19<sup>th</sup> April 1850, or otherwise - And all other rights and privileges  
thereto belonging, and all buildings, ertures and fixtures thereon - And also  
two stone Houses and their Lots of ground, situate in said Weverton, in section  
four and on parts of lots No 3 & 4, according to the Plat of said Town, and bounded  
on the West by the Lot of David Linnow & Co, and on the East by the house & Lot of  
William Longbridge, and fronting on Canal Avenue and running back  
to a ten foot Alley - - Also two other houses and Lots situated in said Town  
in section four and comprising parts of Lots No 6 & 8 and all of Lot No 7. ac-  
cording to the Plat of said Town, and adjoining the house and Lot of Robert  
Beale on the West, and the Lot of the Weverton Company on the East, and fronting
