

A Solly his Solicitor, filed his Bill of Complaint in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, alleging the execution of said Mortgage to him by the said Company, and the further fact of its non payment, and praying a sale of the Mortgaged Premises. -
 That on the 25th day of January 1860, a decree was passed by the said Court, for a sale of said property, and that on the 18th of April 1860, William P. Maulsby Esq. Trustee proceeded to make sale of said property - and sold the same to Caspar W Weaver, at and for the sum of \$10,000, which sale was finally ratified and confirmed to the said Weaver by the said Court, on the 21st day of May in the year 1860 -

That although said property has been so sold as alleged and stated, yet no deed has ever been executed for the same. -

That the said Caspar W Weaver since the sale of said property, has departed this life intestate, leaving the following children, his heirs at law, to wit Adam Weaver Katharine Weaver who married William O Collins, Charlotte Weaver, who married Cole Saw, Patrick W Weaver, and Virginia Weaver, all of whom are non residents of the State of Maryland being residents of the of the State of Ohio - Also that Thomas H Crompton of Frederick County Md is the Administrator of Caspar W Weaver. -

That it would be to the interest of all the parties concerned to have a sale of said real estate and premises, under a decree of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, so that an unincumbered title can be given to the purchaser or purchasers for the same, the proceeds of sale after paying costs and expenses of proceeding, to be appropriated to the payment of the liens upon said property according to their priority. The Bill then prays subpoenas against the resident Defendants and an Order of Publication against the Non residents. -

It is thereupon adjudged and ordered, that the complainants, by causing a copy of this Order to be inserted in some Newspaper published in Frederick County Md. once a week for four successive weeks before the 24th day of September 1870, give notice to the said absent defendants of the object and substance of this Bill, and warn them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before the 12th day of December 1870, to answer the premises and show cause if any they have, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
