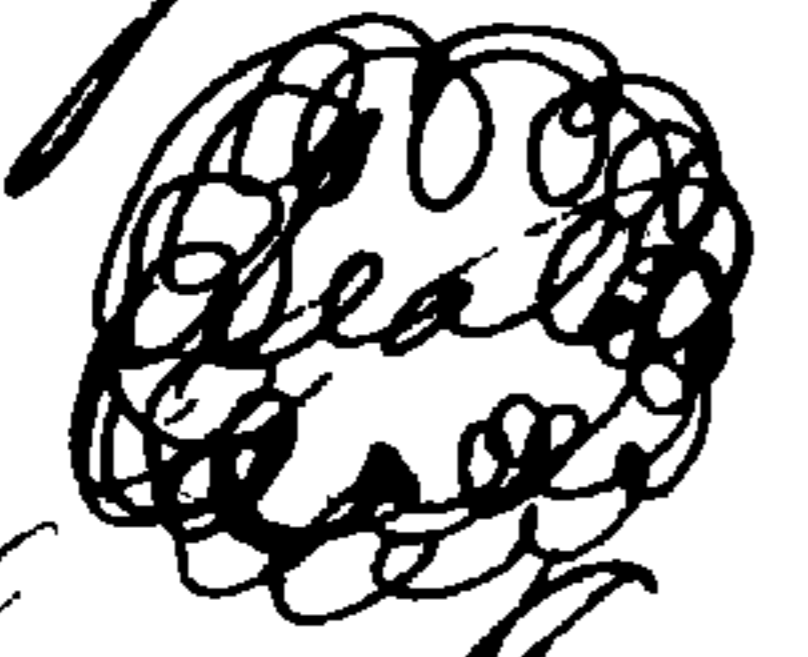
Upon Application made by the Petition filed in this cause for
a Commission to be issued to the State of New Jersey, to two Commissioners
resident in said State, Authorizing, them or either of them to appoint a guardian
for Catharine J. Trego, the infant Defendant residing in said State, and take
the answer of said infant, by said Guardian ~ It is thereupon this 28th day of
December in the year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy One ordered that a
Commission issue to Rev. Elow N. Smith and Miss Nancy R. Stanley of the
State of New Jersey, Authorizing, them or either of them to appoint a Guardian
for, and take the Answer of Catharine J. Trego, the infant defendant, resident
in said State, by said Guardian, And it is further Ordered that the execution
of said Commission shall be authenticated in the same manner as Commis-
sions are now Executed and Authenticated for resident infants.

The State of Maryland, To Rev. Elow N. Smith and Nancy
M. Stanley of the State of New Jersey, Greeting. ~

Whereas, Francis Markell Guardian of Catharine J. Trego, Basil Norris Trego &
John T. Trego, has lately exhibited his Bill of Complaint, before me in the Circuit Court for
Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, against Catharine J. Trego, Basil
Norris Trego and John T. Trego.

And Whereas I have, by my writ, lately Commanded the said defendants
to appear before me in said Court as a Court of Equity at a certain day now
past, to answer the said Bill of Complaint, but for as much as the said
Catharine J. Trego is an infant, under age residing in the State of New Jersey,
and cannot answer the said Bill of Complaint nor defend this suit, without having
a guardian assigned in that behalf ~ Now Ye, therefore, that I have given
unto you on either of you full power and authority in pursuance of the
special order in said Court, to assign and appoint a guardian for the aforesaid
infant, and to take the Answer of the said infant, by such guardian to the
said Bill of Complaint, and therefore I Command you, that at such certain
day and place as you shall think fit, you or either of you assign and
appoint a guardian for the aforesaid infant, and take the Answer of the said
infant by such guardian to the said Bill of Complaint, on such guardian's cor-
poral oath upon the Holy Evangelists, to be administered by you, the said answer
being distinctly and plainly made; And when you shall have taken the said
Answer, you are to send the same closed up under your seal, together with your
Certificate of your having assigned and appointed such guardian as aforesaid
and this writ, unto me in said Court.
