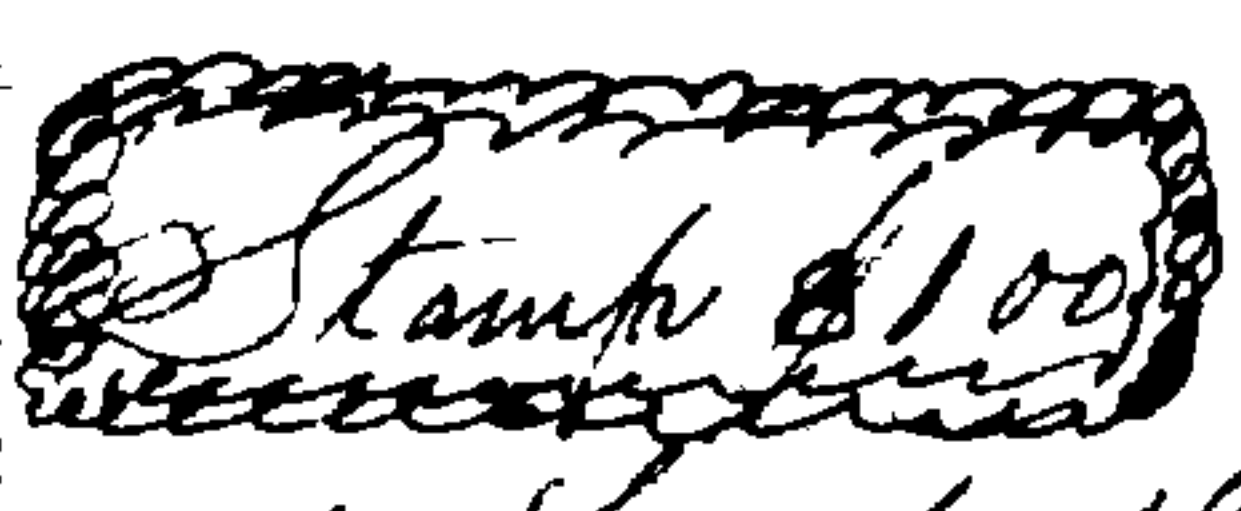

This Indenture made this 2nd day of February in the year of our Lord 1848 between Thomas W. Morgan, and Mary Ann Morgan, his wife of Frederick City, Frederick County, and State of Maryland, of the one part and William St. Albaugh of the City, County, and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth, that the said Thomas W. Morgan, and Mary Ann Morgan his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of Five Thousand Dollars current money to them in hand paid by the said William St. Albaugh, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is herein set forth, have given granted bargained, and sold, aliened, infeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents, doth give, grant, bargain and sell, alien, release, infeoff Convey and Confirm unto him the said William St. Albaugh, his heirs and assigns, all that certain part of Lot No 5th, situate, lying and being in the City of Frederick aforesaid and fronting 30 feet more or less on Patrick's Street, and running back the full width thereof to Church Street 393 feet more or less, being the same part of a Lot of ground which was this day conveyed to said Thomas W. Morgan by Thomas W. Hickson - Wm St. Albaugh and Susanna his wife & Wm C. Hickson, reference being had to said deed will fully and at large appear, Together with all and singular the buildings improvements, privileges, Advantages and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, And all the claim, right, title, interest, trust, property claim and demand whatsoever at Law and in Equity of them the said Thomas W. Morgan and Mary Ann his wife, of us, and to the same, To Have and to Hold the said described part of a lot or portion of ground and premises, with every other of its contents, unto him the said William St. Albaugh, his heirs and assigns - To the only proper use and behoof of the said William St. Albaugh his heirs and assigns forever and to and for no other use intent or purpose whatsoever.
