


3<sup>rd</sup> line S 58° E 50 3/4 perches, N 34 E 40 of a perch to said Baker's Corner, thence with his land

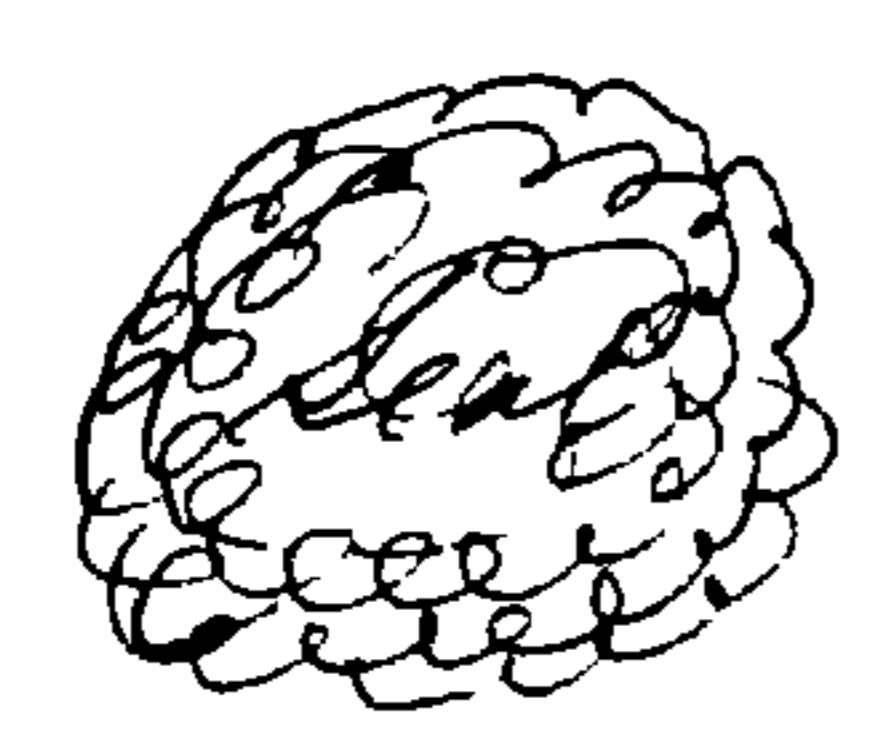
