To the 6<sup>th</sup> Sub. - That said George Baker left the following children, namely, George, married to Anna; Henry A. married to Mary Crouse; Jacob, married but name of wife unknown to deponent; Mary, married to Christian Warner; and Ellen Baker; all adults, except Ellen Baker, who is an infant under the age of twenty One years, and all residing in Frederick County, Maryland, except Jacob Baker and wife, who reside in the state of North Carolina. ~

To the 7<sup>th</sup> Sub. - That he is - that he looks at "Exhibits Nos 5, 6 & 7" now here shown him, and that said Exhibits properly describe the real estate of which the said George Baker Senr died seized and possessed. ~
