To the 2nd Sub. - That he knows nothing. ~

To the 3rd Sub. - That he knows nothing. ~

To the 4th Sub. - That he was - That he is dead - that he died in Frederick County Maryland, on the nineteenth day of April, Eighteen Hundred and Seventy-two. ~


To the 5th Sub. That he was; that he left a widow named Amanda, who now resides in Frederick County, Maryland. ~

To the 6th Sub. - That he left children as follows, namely, George married to Ann - ; Henry A. married to Mary Crouse; Jacob, married, but name of wife unknown to this deponent; Henry, married to Christian Warner and Ellen Baker; All adults, except Ellen Baker, who is an infant, under the age of twenty one years, and all residing in Frederick County Maryland, except Jacob Baker and wife, who reside in the State of North Carolina. ~


To the 7th Sub. - That he knows the lands of which the said George Baker died seized and possessed; That he looks at "Exhibits 5 & 6, & 7" (now here shown him), and that said Exhibits properly describe the lands of which the said George Baker died seized and possessed. ~



To the 8th Sub. - That he was one of the appraisers of said personal estate and that the value thereof was about One hundred and thirty dollars, (\$130 00) and totally inadequate and insufficient to pay the debts of the said George Baker, deceased. ~

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, and no further time being required for the production of Evidence, the Commissioners closed the said Commission, and therewith returned the same, under their hands and seals on this twenty sixth day of December, Eighteen Hundred and Seventy-two.
