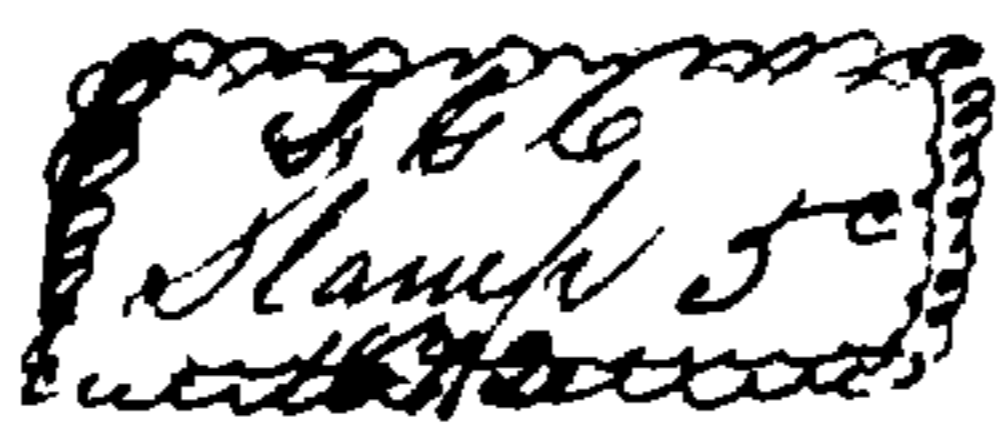
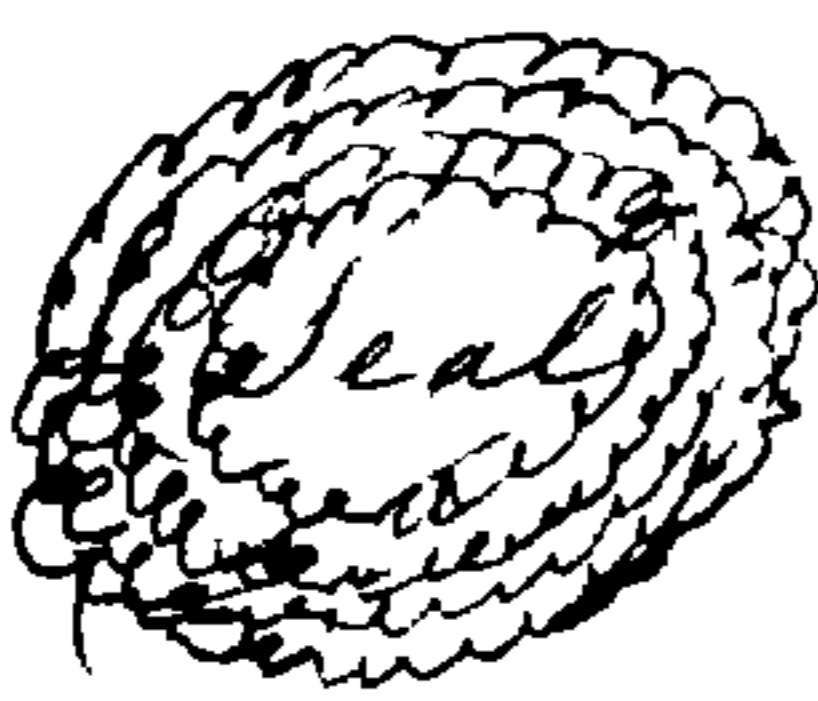

This Indenture, made the second day of September, Eighteen Hundred and Forty One, between John P. Stollenmeyer and Susannah his wife, Nelson Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife, Daniel Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife Leven Hurley and Elizabeth his wife, heirs at Law and representatives of George Stollenmeyer, late of Frederick County in the State of Maryland on the one part, and George Stollenmeyer of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth, that they the said John P. Stollenmeyer and Susannah his wife, Nelson Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife, Daniel Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife, Leven Hurley and Elizabeth his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and ten Dollars current money to them in hand paid by the said George Stollenmeyer, the receipt whereof, they the said John P. Stollenmeyer and Susannah his wife, Nelson Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife, Daniel Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife, Leven Hurley and Elizabeth his wife, do the hereby acknowledge, hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargained, sold, alien, conveyed, and confirm, unto the said George Stollenmeyer his heirs and assigns, all the right and title and interest of them the said John P. Stollenmeyer and Susannah his wife, Nelson Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife, Daniel Stollenmeyer and Hannah his wife Leven Hurley and Elizabeth his wife, of and to their ~~old~~ divided interest of all the following part of a tract or parcel of land, situate lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, being part of a tract of Land called the "Resurvey on Almost Night", and running thence South twenty degrees West fifty English perches, South twelve degrees East, thirty four perches, East Thirty five perches, South Nineteen degrees East, twenty three and a half perches, then leaving the Outlines thereof North Forty six degrees East forty five perches, North ten degrees East thirty five perches to intersect the given line of the whole tract of Land called the "Resurvey on Almost Night" North twelve degrees, West Twenty four perches to the beginning of the whole tract of Land called the Resurvey on Almost Night", North South ~~is~~ degrees West ten perches, then by a straight line to the beginning containing Forty two and a half Acres of Land More or less, together with all and singular the buildings, improvements and appurtenances whatsoever therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, to have and to hold the said part of a tract or parcel of Land so as aforesaid described, and all and singular Other the premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with their and every of their Appurtenances unto the said George Stollenmeyer his heirs and assigns forever, and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatsoever, and I do hereby our heirs and assigns agree to any time and forever hereafter, to warrant and defend the said above described Land to him the said George Stollenmeyer, his heirs and assigns -
