had - And if they had any other children than those you named, and whether Susan  
Stottlemeyer had any other children than those you named - And if any of the above  
named children have died, leaving children, state the names and residence of such children.

3<sup>rd</sup> Int. ~ Did you know Makala a daughter of said George Stottlemeyer and Susan  
Stottlemeyer? If yes, did she marry, and whom? And where did she reside? is  
she living or dead? If dead, did she leave children, and where do they reside?  
State all your knowledge herein? ~

4<sup>th</sup> Int. ~ State the residence and ages of the several children, and children  
of said George and Susan Stottlemeyer, according to the best of your knowledge  
whether personal or from reputation in the family? ~

5<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory - Do you know the real estate whereof George, and after his  
death Susan Stottlemeyer his wife died possessed? If yes, where situate, how  
many acres does it contain, look at Exhibits No 2 & No 3 now shown you, are  
the lands described therein, the same lands referred to you by you in your  
answer to the previous part of this interrogatory. ~

6<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory - In your answer to the last interrogatory - you say, you know  
the lands of which George and Susan Stottlemeyer his wife died possessed.  
Can such lands be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested?
