

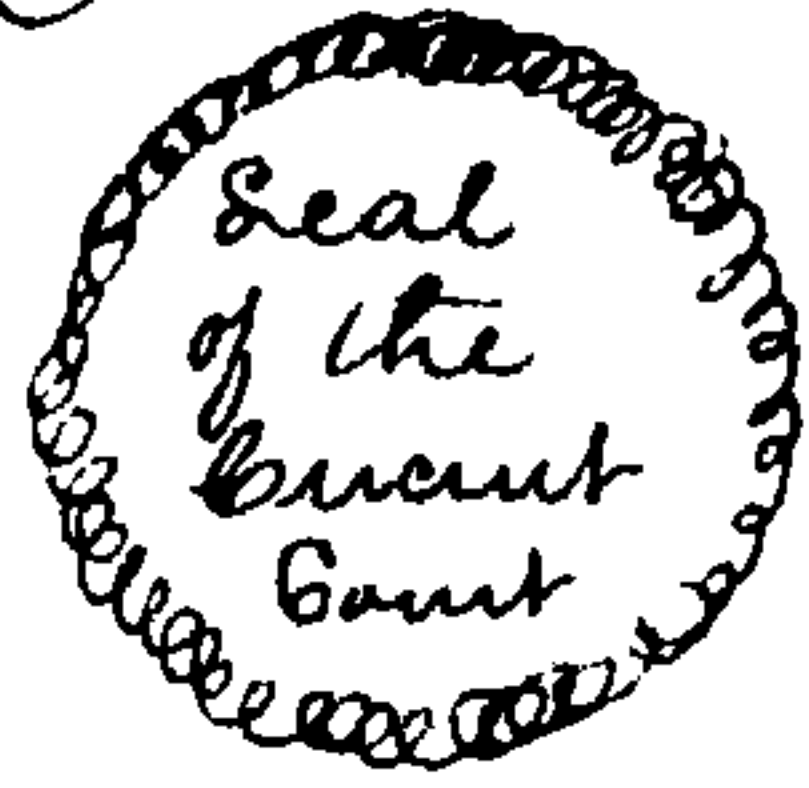

This Indenture, made this ninth day of March, in the year Eighteen hundred and forty seven, between Isaac Walker and Jacob Walker, Executor of John Walker deceased of Frederick County, State of Maryland, of the one part and George Murdock of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Isaac Walker & Jacob Walker Executors as aforesaid do by the power vested in them by the last will and testament of John Walker, late of Frederick County deceased bearing date August twenty seventh Eighteen hundred and forty for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred & thirty two dollars and forty five cents to them in hand paid by the said George Murdock the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell alien enfeoffed and confirm to him the said George Murdock his heirs and assigns forever the following piece of land situated in the County aforesaid, being part of a tract of land which was on or about the 23<sup>d</sup> of May 1817, conveyed to the said John Walker by John Ritchie and Benjamin Biggs, executors of Abraham Hoff, being part of a tract of land called Discovery surveyed Beginning at the end of twelve fms on the given line of the original tract called Discovery, reversed from the beginning and running thence 1<sup>st</sup> S 8 1/2<sup>o</sup> W 55 3/4 fms to a marked Hickory 2<sup>d</sup> S 80 1/2<sup>o</sup> E 24 3/4 fms to a stone 3<sup>rd</sup> N 10 1/2<sup>o</sup> E 7 fms to a marked Hickory 4<sup>th</sup> N 68 W 8 1/4 fms to a stone 5<sup>th</sup> N 28 E 58 fms 6<sup>th</sup> S 89 1/2<sup>o</sup> W 47 fms to the beginning, containing Thirteen and one fourth acres and nine perches Together with the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining all the estate right title interest trust property claim or demand whatever of them the said Isaac Walker and Jacob Walker, Executors as aforesaid of in and to the said lands and premises and every part thereof To have and to hold the said land and premises with the appurtenances to the said George Murdock his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said George Murdock his heirs and assigns forever and the said Isaac Walker and Jacob Walker Executors as aforesaid for themselves and their heirs the said lands and premises and every part and parcel thereof against themselves and their heirs and against all and every person or persons claiming by from or under them or their heirs shall and will hereafter warrant and forever defend by these presents And the said Isaac Walker and Jacob Walker Executors as aforesaid and
