Dell, Frank Bennet and Emma S. Bennet his wife of the City of Baltimore, and against Lewis H. Dell and Ellen Dell, his wife, George T. Dell, Georgianna S. Dell, George R. Hyung, Eliza Hyung, William Hyung, Theodor Shultz, Henrietta Shultz, Sophia K. Shultz, and Mary M. Shultz, of Frederick County, Maryland, commanding them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein, and your Complainants will ever pray

To the Honorable the Judges of Frederick County Court, sitting as a Court of Equity. The subscribers beg leave to report to your Honorable Court, sitting as aforesaid, that in pursuance of the Commission to them issued in this matter from your said Honorable Court authorizing and requiring them to lay off and assign the dower of Juliet C. Thomas, widow of the late Samuel Thomas, in and out of the real estate of the said Samuel Thomas, having first taken the oath to the said Commission annexed and having given due notice of all parties concerned, we went to and upon the said real estate and examined the same carefully and thereupon laid off the dower of the said Juliet C. as follows to wit: For the dower of the cleared land all that part of said real estate, contained within the following courses to wit beginning at the end of the 36th line of the whole tract and runs thence with the outline thereof to the end of 55 7/16 perches on the 45th line then with a straight line to the aforesaid line beginning containing 77 acres & 30 fms and for dower in the wood land all that part of a estate, contained in the following courses to wit beginning at the end of 12 fms on the 30th line of the whole tract and running thence with the outline thereof reversed to end of the 78th line, then with said line reversed & 57 deg N 36 fms then South 72 deg E 100 fms then with a straight line to the beginning containing 40 acres & 8 fms & further assigned for the benefit of the dower, and as part thereof a Road one rod wide, marked on plat No 1, from B to C adjoining the outline
