The object of this suit is to procure a decree for a sale of certain mortgaged premises in Frederick County, which were on the second day of May Eighteen hundred and Seventy, mortgaged by Richard Simpson to the complainant, the Bill states that on the second day of May Eighteen hundred and Seventy, Rachel Simpson conveyed certain Real Estate which is particularly described in the complainant's Bill and in Exhibit A unto Complainant, by way of Mortgage to same, the payment of Fourteen hundred and thirty three dollars with interest from the date on or before the first day of April Eighteen hundred and seventy one which was then due and owing from the Estate of the said Rachel Simpson to the complainant, that said Rachel W. Simpson died intestate in the month of September Eighteen hundred and Seventy, and that the Equity of redemption in said mortgaged premises devolved to her children and heirs at Law, to wit; Lorena now wife of Mr. Geo. B. Aiken. Sophia now wife of Augustus Crapster. Dr. Thomas W. Simpson. Richard W. Simpson the complainant. Ida Simpson. Edward Simpson and George Simpson residents of the State of Maryland. It is therefore ordered and adjudged that the complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County once a week for four successive weeks before the first day of January 1872, giving notice to Edward Simpson and George Simpson the non resident defendants mentioned in said Bill of the object and substance of said Bill and warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the second day of April 1872, to show cause if any they have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
