Trustees Report of Sale in County no 2618

To the Honorable W. Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity.
The report of Oscar P. Crampton and Thomas A. Crampton Trustees appointed by the decree in this case to make sale of certain Real Estate therein mentioned shows that after giving Bond for the faithful discharge of their trust as required by said decree and giving notice of the time place manner and terms of sale in the Republican Citizen a newspaper printed in Frederick Town for more than three successive weeks before the day of sale they did pursuant to said notice attend on the 2nd of February 1856 & then and there proceeded to sell the said Real Estate as follows:
Your Trustees offered at Public Sale the old Home Stead Farm particularly described in deed marked Exhibit No 4 filed in this cause & sold the same except a quarter of an Acre previously sold to John Graham he being then and there the highest bidder therefor at and for the sum of Sixty two dollars per Acre making in all \$11702.50
Your Trustees then offered for sale the farm described in Exhibit No. 3 here filed and sold the same for Fifty five dollars per Acre making in all the sum of \$6176 93³/₄ to William Graham he being then and there the highest bidder therefor. Your Trustees then offered for sale the farm described in deed marked Exhibit No. 1 here filed and sold the same to Benjamin Phelps he being then and there the highest bidder therefor at and for the sum of Sixty dollars and a half per Acre making in all \$10458. 93³/₄ and Your Trustees also sold a small Lot containing a quarter of an Acre to George W. Janney and William Elliott as a school Lot for the sum of Thirty five dollars, The whole sales amounted to \$28,623.37¹/₂
Your Trustees have taken Memoranda in writing from all said purchasers and have no doubt that the terms of sale being those prescribed by the decree will be punctually complied with on the ratification of the same by your Honorable Court
