

2nd Int: That he was acquainted with Levi Grimes formerly a resident of Frederick County Maryland, that he is dead that he died intestate in Frederick County Maryland during the summer of the year 1871, and that he never was married.

3rd Int: That the said Levi Grimes left the following heirs at law viz: Otto Grimes aged forty two years and residing in Frederick County Maryland, Lucy Grimes aged fifty six years and residing in Frederick County Maryland, Octha Little aged forty five years and residing in Adams County Pennsylvania, Harriet Gough aged fifty years and residing in Frederick County Maryland, that the above are brothers and sisters of said Levi Grimes decd. Levi F. Grimes aged thirty years and residing in Frederick County Maryland, Mary S Brown aged twenty seven years and residing in Carroll County Maryland, Margaret S Peck aged twenty three years & residing in Carroll County Maryland, Harriet S Crabb aged twenty two years and residing in Carroll County Maryland, Sophia J. Hiteshow aged about twenty six years and residing in Carroll County Maryland, Martha S Ruedollar aged about twenty four years and residing in Carroll County Maryland, William Oliver Grimes an infant under twenty one years of age and residing in Carroll County Maryland, that these are the children of Melow S Grimes a brother of said Levi Grimes deceased, who died intestate during June 1867 and who were all living at the time of the death of the said Levi Grimes.

4th Int: That he is acquainted with the Real Estate of which the said Levi Grimes died seized and possessed, that he looks at the Exhibits A & B, now here shown him and that the Real Estate therein described is the same of which the said Levi Grimes died seized and possessed.

5th Int: That said Real Estate cannot be divided among the parties interested without loss and injury as if divided the parcels would be too small for advantageous cultivation or sale and that it will be for the benefit and advantage of all the parties concerned that the same be sold and the proceeds distributed amongst the parties entitled as the property is daily becoming of less value that it is a small property and in its present condition it would take all the income to keep it in proper repair and the proceeds of sale would yield more income than if rented or cultivated.

There being no other witnesses present to be examined and no further time being required for the production of evidences the Commissioners closed said Commission and herewith return the same under their hands and seals on the Eighteenth day of January Eighteen hundred and seventy two.
