 9th Did or did not the Complainant pay any funeral expenses for the burial of said Philip Karn if yea state fully your knowledge herein.
 10th State further any thing you may know that would be to the advantage of the Complainant.

Testimony

At the execution of the annexed commission issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, and to me directed empowering me to examine evidences in the cause therein depending between Thomas P. Karn as Complainant and William H. Karn & Wife Joctus as Defendants I William B. Allison Commissioner therein named did on the 23rd day of April 1874 at my Office in Frederick City Maryland them and there proceed to take the following testimony to wit -

The Complainant filed with the Commissioner as evidence "Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 & 20" which are herewith returned by said Commissioner.

Thomas P. Karn a witness of lawful age produced upon the part of the Complainant being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioner & herewith returned deposes and says to the -

1st Int: I know all the parties to this suit & have known them all for some years.

2nd Int. I was acquainted with Philip Karn he died in Frederick County Md. in June 1869.

3rd Int. He was stock at "Exhibit No. 2" which properly describes the Real Estate of which the said Philip Karn died seized and also described his interest of an undivided two thirds in said property.

4th Int. He was not married at the time of his death.

5th Int. He left the following heirs namely. Thomas P. Karn Adult and Complainant in this case and residing in Frederick County Maryland, Matilda a daughter married to David L. Willard both Adults and both residing in Frederick County Maryland, George W. Howe who is the surviving husband of Mary Karn deceased who was a daughter of Philip Karn deceased Adult and residing in the State of Pennsylvania Mary Howe deceased has a daughter still living named Mary
